On ANZAC Day, Australia as a nation pauses to remember the sacrifices made by many since the birth of this Nation through many wars up to and including today for our current prosperous peaceful lifestyle. It is interesting that we struggle with the concept of God sacrificing much to enable us to enter into a free relationship with Him.

So we praise God for the glorious grace he has poured out on us who belong to His dear Son. He is so rich in kindness and grace that he purchased our freedom (redemption) with the blood of His Son and forgave our sins. **Ephesians 1:6-7**

In Paul's time slaves were freed by the payment of a ransom this was a common Greco-Roman practice called 'redemption'. Paul says that we are freed from our bondage as slaves to sin by Christ paying the price – the price was the shedding of His blood. If you ever happen to read *The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe*, C.S.
