

MSO extends a heartfelt appreciation to her members and her supporters who are carrying out our Lord's Great Commission in their global military ministerial works. Below are the MSO's June reports:

1 MSO 20th Anniversary Thanksgiving Service was Held.

MSO, established on June 1, 2002 under the name of AMCF Mission Support Organization, is one of the AMCF Principal Support Organizations (PSOs) which is doing its best to support AMCF mission activities with the other PSOs (ACCTS of the United States and MMI of the United Kingdom) and contribute to the evangelization of the soldiers around the world through mutual cooperation. On June 4, 2022 (10 a.m. to 2 p.m.), a thanksgiving worship service to commemorate its 20th anniversary was held at the Main Worship Hall of the Central Military Chapel(CMC), and about 130 people including representatives of military mission-related organizations, sponsoring churches and MSO members attended.

In the sermon entitled "Who will protect us?", the first part of the ceremony, Pastor Kim, Sam-hwan, the President of the Military Evangelical Association of Korea (MEAK), emphasized that only God can protect our global military missionary work through the Holy Spirit and the Gospel of our Lord.

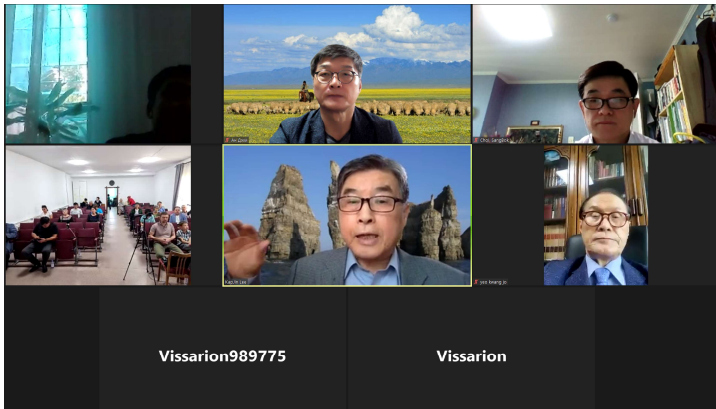

2 MSO Participated in Central Asia Regional Conference (2022 Stan-Dart) and Missionary Activities in Stan Countries.

(A) On May 21, 2022, the Stan-Dart Conference was held with the host of the Kazakhstan MCF. 25 Kazakhstan Christian soldiers, Kyrgyzstan MCF president, and MSO cooperative missionary Kang Tae-won participated in face-to-face. Six members of MSO, including Senior Advisor General Lee, Kap-jin, participated online.

(B) From June 2 to 8, MSO Cooperative Missionary Kang Tae-won and Central Asia regional team leader Col. Ahn, Dae-hee visited the Tajikistan MCF. They interacted with and encouraged the members of Tajikistan MCF which has been growing to a new and energetic organization since its establishment in 2019, explored ways for the development of the Tajikistan MCF together, and tried to discover local pastors who are interested in the MCF activities.

3 2022 MEO Program to be Conducted Face to Face

The 2022 MEO (Military Evangelism Observation) Program, which invites representatives of military Christians from countries where the MCF has not yet been established or whose activities are weak, to

Seoul, will be held from June 20 (Mon) to 27 (Mon) at Naval Central Chapel in Seoul for 7 nights and 8 days. 15 people from 12 countries will participate. The Combined Assistance and Training Team (CATT) will be formed with instructors from ACCTS in the US, MMI in the UK, and MSO in Korea to conduct the program.

During the MEO-P period, the AMCF and 3 PSOs' activities will be introduced to the next AMCF president-nominee General Essel Soriano (Philippines) by 3 PSOs' chief executive directors, Colonel Philip Exner of ACCTS, General Roddy Porter of MMI, and General Park, Nam-pil of MSO. The AMCF pending issues will also be discussed, including preparations for the take-over of the AMCF Presidency in October this year.

4 Activities of Korean Military Christian Fellowship (KMCF)

- (A) 2024 National Salvation Prayer Meeting to be Held in Commemoration of Korean War
The 2022 National Salvation Prayer Meeting will be held from June 22 (Wed)-24 (Fri) 18:30-20:30, once a day, a total of three times during the period, at the Armed Forces Central Military Chapel (CMC), co-hosted by the Korean Military Chaplains' Association and KMCF. The prayer meeting will be held face-to-face and online (YouTube) at major military chapels across the county. On June 22, the participants of the 2022 MEO-P will attend the dawn worship service (05:30) at the CMC, the major support and sponsor church for MSO, and worship together with Korean soldiers and their families. They will also attend the opening service of the Prayer Meeting at 19:00 on the same day.
- (B) Farewell and Welcome Luncheon for the KMCF Presidents / Incoming President's Meeting with the Representatives of Military Mission-related Organizations
On Thursday, June 30, 11:50~13:30, the take-over ceremony of the KMCF Presidency will be held at the Army Hall in Yongsan, Seoul. General Kim, Seung-gyeom, the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, will be inaugurated as the 34th president. The representatives of 7 military mission-related organizations will attend, and from MSO, former AMCF Chairman General Lee, Pil-seop, MSO Honorary Chairman General Lee, Jun, MSO Chairman General Park, Nam-pil, and Secretary General Pastor Chung, Bong-dae will also attend.

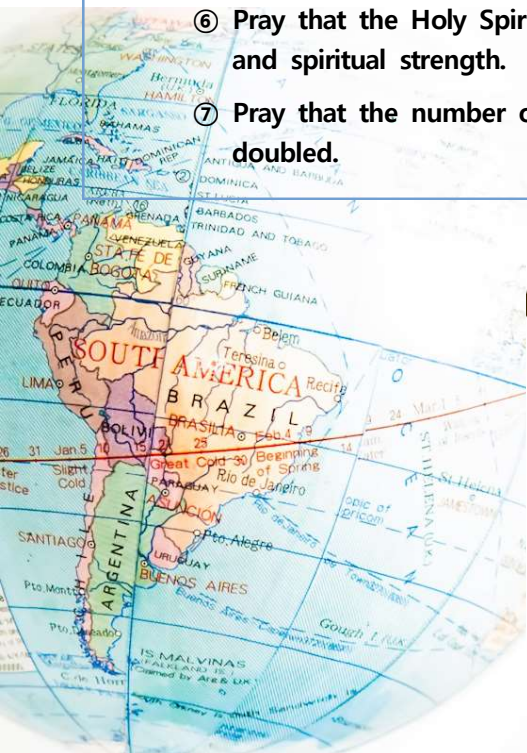
5 Prayer Requests

- For the AMCF
 - ① Pray that MCFs will be established as soon as possible in 45 countries which have no MCFs yet (especially Brunei in Southeast Asia, Micronesia in the Pacific, Israel in the Middle East)
 - ② May God's wisdom be with the AMCF President General Weerasooriya, the Vice Presidents, the Preparatory Committee, and the Host Country MCF (the UMCEB), which are preparing for the Brazilian World Conference.
 - ③ Pray that God will guide General Essel Soriano, who has been appointed as the next AMCF president, to be prepared as a faithful worker for the AMCF ministry.
 - ④ Pray that the MCF presidents and leaders will be given the wisdom and power of God so as to establish and revitalize MCFs of their own.
 - ⑤ Pray that 3 AMCF PSOs (ACCTS, MMI, and MSO) will effectively support and closely cooperate for world military missionary ministries. Pray also that the 50th anniversary of ACCTS will be prepared by God's grace.

- ⑥ May the war caused by Russia's invasion of Ukraine end and peace may come soon; May God's grace be filled with AMCF and national MCFs that help Ukrainian soldiers, their families and refugees.
- ⑦ For the safety of Christian soldiers and their families in countries where social unrest and suffering are exacerbated by civil wars, military coups, and the threat of war (Myanmar, Palestine, and Afghanistan, to name a few).
- ⑧ For local MSO cooperative missionaries to Japan, Japanese Christian soldiers and military mission workers who are striving to establish a church for the Japanese Self-Defense Forces, for video ministry, and for the revitalization of civilian churches' cooperation with Japanese MCF.

• For the MSO

- ① Pray that in 2022, as a principal supporting organization for the world military missionary ministry, MSO will overcome the COVID-19 Pandemic and fulfill the AMCF missions graciously.
- ② To ensure that the visa issuance and ticket issuance of overseas participants of the 2022 MEO-P proceed smoothly, and that they do not become infected with Corona virus before and after entering the country; May God's wisdom and power come to the instructors and preparatory members who are preparing for the MEO-P.
- ③ The FMC-K Interaction plan is well established and prepared so that foreign military officers and cadets studying in Korea participating in the program be nurtured as reliable military Christian leaders.
- ④ For the health and safety of Christian soldiers, their families and local MSO cooperative missionaries participating in the discipleship training in Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan.
- ⑤ Pray that the discipleship training in the military of the Indochina Peninsula region by the MSO cooperative missionary will be resumed as soon as possible.
- ⑥ Pray that the Holy Spirit will lead all MSO members in peace in 2022 and give them physical and spiritual strength.
- ⑦ Pray that the number of regular sponsoring churches and individuals for MSO ministries will be doubled.
