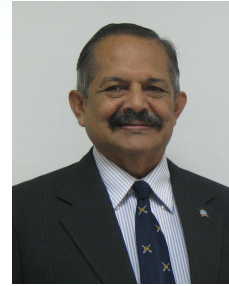


MSO extends a heartfelt appreciation to her members and her supporters who are carrying out our Lord's Great Commission in their global military ministerial works. Below are the MSO's October reports:

## 1. Major General(R) Essel Soriano was Inaugurated as the AMCF President.

- (a) The AMCF President Inauguration Ceremony was held on Sunday, October 2nd from 19:30 to 21:30 at the White Sulphur Springs, Pennsylvania, USA.
- (b) The outgoing President General Srilal Weerasooriya of the Republic of Sri Lanka has faithfully dedicated himself to the encouragement of Christian soldiers around the world and to the establishment and revitalization of national MCFs since 2012.
- (c) The inaugurated President Major General(R) Essel Soriano of the Republic of the Philippines has been active in various organizations serving Christian soldiers around the world as well as serving as vice president of AMCF Southeast Asia Region since July 2019.
- (d) The MSO Chairman MG(R) Park, Nam-pil and the Deputy Secretary General BG(R) Choi, Nag-jung attended the ceremony celebrating together with the AMCF Presidents, Vice Presidents, and PSO representatives and prayed for the newly inaugurated AMCF President.

## 2. 2022 Foreign Military Christians in Korea (FMC-K) Interaction Plan

- (a) The MSO conducts FMC-K Interaction with the purpose of nurturing world military leaders and helping the Christian Military Association through interaction for foreign officers and cadets currently studying at Korean military educational institutions.
- (b) 39 foreign active duty officers and cadets participate in the interaction from *Defense Language Institute, National Defense University, Army/Air Force/Naval Colleges, and Naval Academy*. In the face-to-face phase of the Interaction conducted in Jeju Island, 37 foreign families will be added for a total of 76 people.
- (c) The Interaction is held for 4 days (2 days online and 2 days face-to-face in Jeju).

### 3. MSO Supported a Ugandan Christian Soldier who Got Shot in Action.

(a) On September 10, the ACCTS informed the MSO that two Ugandan soldiers were killed while carrying out a mission to arrest a shooter, including Lieutenant Jude, a participant in ACCTS's online trauma healing training program, who got a severe facial gunshot wound and is now recovering from surgery.

(b) LTC(R) Yoon, Moon-soo, head of the MSO East and Francophone Africa team, with help of Dr. Emmanuel who returned to Uganda after completing training at Yonsei University Medical School in Korea this year, visited Lieutenant Jude to the hospital for giving comfort and encouragement. LTC(R) Yoon and Dr. Emmanuel agreed to cooperate in medical consultation and support by sharing information with treating doctors.

(c) The MSO prayed for Lieutenant Jude to recover through God's healing, and collected 3 million Ugandan shillings from its individual supporters. LTC(R) Yoon, who visited Uganda then, delivered it to Lieutenant Jude through General Wakaalo, the Vice President of East Africa, on September 26.

### 4. The President of the Ukrainian Missionary Association Paid a Visit to MSO.

(a) Missionary Song, Eun-yong, President of the Ukrainian Missionary Association, visited the MSO office on September 30. Former AMCF President General Lee, Pil-sup, Senior Pastor Son, Bong-gi of the Central Military Chapel (CMC), Secretary General Rev. Chung, Bong-dae, World Mission Director COL. Chang, Yong-kwan, Central Asia Team Leader COL. Ahn, Dae-hee, and Education Office Director Col. Choi, Sang-bok were present to welcome him and introduce the military ministry activities of the AMCF.



(b) The MSO also introduced to him how the Ukrainian military chaplaincy

system was established in cooperation with the MSO in 2016 and the ministry activities of Ukrainian military pastors in cooperation with the civil and military churches there.

- (c) The MSO has supported the activities of Ukrainian military pastors with concerted efforts of Korean civilian as well as military churches including the Armed Forces Central Church, even in the midst of the war between Ukraine and Russia in 2022. The Ukrainian Missionary Association and MSO expressed their determination to expand their support to the Ukrainian military chaplains while sharing their support activities for the Ukrainian military ministry.

## **5.** Prayer Requests

We humbly request you to pray for the AMCF and the MSO. Let's pray together.


- For the AMCF

- ① Pray that MCFs will be established as soon as possible in 45 countries which have no MCFs yet (especially in Iraq and Equatorial Guinea).
- ② Pray that the former AMCF President General Weerasooriya will lead a healthy and happy life in the Lord's grace, and that the Lord give the new AMCF President Major General Essel Soriano wisdom and understanding to fulfill his duties as AMCF President.
- ③ May God's wisdom be with the AMCF President General Soriano, the Vice Presidents, the Preparatory Committee, and the Host Country MCF (the UMCEB), which are preparing for the Brazilian World Conference.
- ④ Pray that the MCF presidents and leaders will be given the wisdom and power of the Lord so as to establish and revitalize MCFs of their own.
- ⑤ Pray that 3 AMCF PSOs (ACCTS, MMI, and MSO) will effectively support and closely cooperate for world military missionary ministries.
- ⑥ For the speedy recovery of Lieutenant Jude, a Ugandan Christian soldier who is suffering from a severe face gunshot wound.
- ⑦ Ask the Lord to protect and guide Ukrainian chaplains and Christian soldiers who are serving on the battlefield; the war between Ukraine and Russia will be quickly ended so that peace in both countries will be secured; and world politics and economy will be stabilized.
- ⑧ Pray that many military soldiers and their families will participate in the AMCF World Prayer Day prayer meeting (October 29) to pray for peace around the world, and for Christian soldiers of the world.
- ⑨ For the safety of Christian soldiers and their families in countries where social unrest and suffering are exacerbated by civil wars, military coups, the threat of war, racial discrimination, and drought and other natural disasters (Myanmar, Sudan, Democratic Republic of Congo, Palestine, Afghanistan, Tanzania, Burkina Faso, Nigeria, to name a few).



● For the MSO

- ① 2022 FMC-K interaction (online Oct 8/10 Oct 15; face-to-face Oct 22-23) has started. Pray that the participating foreign military officers and cadets will complete the 2022 FMC-K Interaction program safely and healthily; Pray that many believers and national MCF leaders will be nurtured through this interaction.
- ② Pray that the AMCF East Asia Interaction (October 22. Sat/Online) proceeds graciously and that 47 participants from 10 countries will be nurtured as leaders of the MCF of each country to contribute to the vitalization of their MCFs.
- ③ For the safety and health of the MSO cooperative missionaries who are planning to visit Almaty, Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan to conduct discipleship training there.
- ④ Pray that the Cambodian MCF will be fully activated and Myanmar MCF activities will be properly reorganized so that Indochina Cornelius Discipleship Training will be normalized as soon as possible.
- ⑤ Pray for many of MSO members, representatives of related organizations, and members of the Armed Forces Central Church to gather at the World Prayer Day prayer meeting (Oct 29) and pray for the world military Christians.
- ⑥ Pray for continuous exchanges between the MEO-P and FMC-K Interaction graduates and the regional teams of MSO World Missions Division to help revitalize world Christian military activities.
- ⑦ Pray for God's guidance in the major ministry activities of Korean missionaries working world-widely in partnership with MSO.
- ⑧ Pray that the Holy Spirit will lead all MSO members in peace in 2022 and give them physical and spiritual strength to accomplish their assigned missions; pray that the number of regular sponsoring churches and individuals for MSO ministries will be doubled.
