1 East and Central Asia Interaction and Stan-Dart Conference Held

With the theme of "Expanding our Vision," the 2023 East and Central Asia Regional Interaction and Stan-Dart Conference were gracefully completed with help of the Holy Spirit. They were held from September 7th to 10th at Chok Tal Village, Issyk-Kul, Kyrgyzstan, in conjunction with the commemoration of the 25th anniversary of the establishment of Kyrgyzstan MCF.

Including AMCF President Essel Soriano, East and Central Asia Regional Vice President Andrew Tzeng (incumbent VP), Pastor Chung, Bong-dae (successor VP), ACCTS' Asia Manager (Rick Ryles), 12 members of Mongolia MCF, 14 of Kazakhstan MCF, 10 of Uzbekistan MCF and 10 of MSO, a total of 85 people from 12 countries participated.

MSO provided airfare and registration fees of \$4,600 in response to the request of the Vice President of the East and Central Asia Region and the President of Kyrgyzstan MCF to support the participation of more Christian military leaders in countries with weak MCF activities in the Central Asia.

It is expected that this Interaction will greatly vitalize the MCFs of the Central Asia, foster many valuable next generation Christian military leaders, and greatly expand the participants' vision of global military missions.

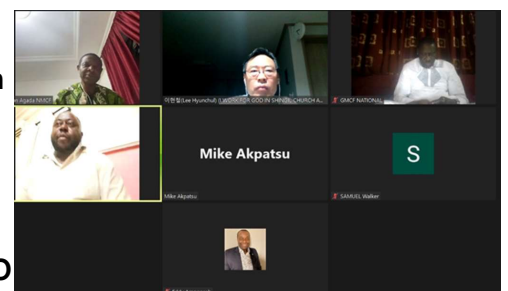


(c) MBS (Military Bible Sticks) Being Effectively Used for Military Evangelism

During the 2023 MEO-P, ACCTS distributed to the participants "Digital Bibles for the World" or "Military Bible Sticks (MBS)" recorded in various languages for military evangelism. It was confirmed that participants of the MEO-P were distributing them to their military chaplains, MCFs, and churches they attended. ACCTS is ready to support individuals and organizations with the MBSs when they request them. Those who need them may contact Col. Rick Reyes, ACCTS Asia Region Manager, through e-mail.

(d) Promoting prayer meetings to establish MCF in Equatorial Guinea

On August 14, through the West Africa prayer meeting, Pastor Bella, who participated in the 2023 MEO-P, requested MSO to pray for a military mission preparation meeting to establish the MCF in Equatorial Guinea. It has been confirmed that Pastor Bella is in communication with 6 soldiers, including a general, for this purpose and is planning a general meeting in September. The West African VP and MSO are praying for the establishment of an MCF in Equatorial Guinea and have decided to actively provide support if needed for the establishment of an MCF there.



(e) Request for prayer and encouragement to establish an MCF in Iraq and Kurdistan

An Iraqi Christian soldier who participated in the 2023 MEO-P is working to establish an MCF in Kurdistan forces. He hopes that the number of Christian soldiers in his county will increase day by day with the help of Jesus Christ. He requested that Christian soldiers around the world pray and encourage for the establishment of the MCFs in the Iraqi and Kurdish forces.

4 A News on Cambodia English Camp

The Cambodia English Camp, which started in 2008, was suspended for three years due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, and then resumed at the Cambodian Marine Command from August 4 to 12, 2023. 21 members of the Central Military Chapel short-term mission team carried out the ministry focusing on military English, children's Bible, and Korean culture, and were able to carry out healthy ministry in an optimal environment with the active support of the unit. On completing the camp, certificates were awarded to 164 soldiers, teenagers, and children who participated in the program, greatly contributing to revitalizing the Cambodian MCF.

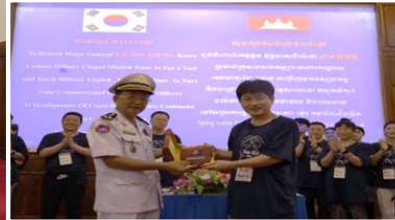

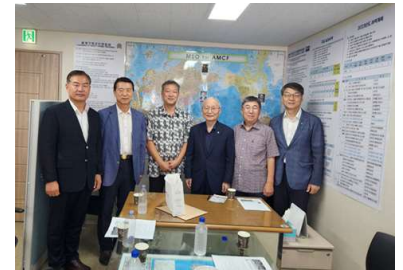

5 Rev. Shin, Dong-jun, Missionary to Kenya, Visited MSO

On August 13, Rev. Shin, who is ministering in Kenya, Tanzania, and Uganda, visited the CMC and MSO. He received a briefing on AMCF and MSO and was decided to work together with MSO in world military ministries. He and MSO will also closely cooperate in the field of military missionary ministry at the 2024 Lausanne Congress on World Evangelization which will be held next year in Korea hosted by Onnuri Church.



6 MSO and KMCF Officers Visited World K-POP Center

On August 4, a group of MSO and KMCF executives visited the World K-POP Center. They were introduced to the World K-Pop Center and discussed ways to cooperate in world military missions using Korean cultural contents.

First, the World K-POP Center decided to organize MMS (Military Mission Service Organizations) to support AMCF and MSO global military missionary ministry and cooperate with MSO and share information.

Second, the two organizations decided to participate in evangelism activities in countries where MCF has not been established and countries where MCF activities are weak through the World K-POP Center's cultural ministry programs such as K-POP, Taekwondo, and medical ministry.

Third, the two organizations decided to develop a plan to support cultural ministry activities of national MCFs in cooperation with Korean missionaries around the world.

Fourth, the two organizations signed an MOU and agreed to strengthen the MSO organization and continue to cooperate in global military missionary work.



7 AMCF Ministries

(a) New ECS VP Inaugurated

The inauguration ceremony of the AMCF Vice President for the East and Central Asia was held on September 10, the last day of the East and Central Asia Regional Conference in Kyrgyzstan. The out-going Vice President, Lieutenant Colonel (ret.) Andrew Tzeng (Taiwan) was appointed on October 18, 2016 and devoted himself greatly to the development of global military missions and the revitalization of the national MCFs of the East Asia region for seven years. The successor, Colonel (ret.) and Reverend Chung, Bong-dae (Korea) took office on September 10 and will carry out a very important mission at the center of global as well as East and Central Asian military missionary ministry.



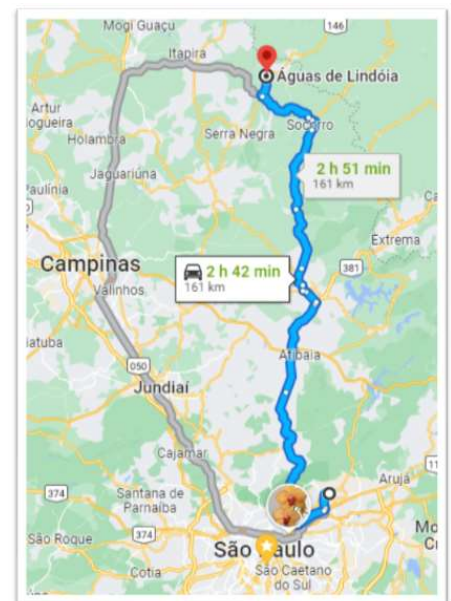
Outgoing VP

(b) The Date and Venue of Brazil World Conference 2024 Fixed

On August 17, the World Conference Preparatory Committee decided at the P&P that the AMCF World Conference 2024 would be held in Agus de Lindoia, Brazil, from October 16 to October 19. It presented the AMCF World Conference Planning Roadmap, which would be followed in close cooperation with AMCF, 3PSOs, regional VPs, and national MCF leaders. AMCF President General Essel Soriano encouraged continued interest and active efforts in selecting participants for the World Conference 2024 and financing their expenses.



(c) AMCF World Prayer Day Designated as Oct 28

AMCF President General Soriano designated October 28 (Saturday), as this year's World Prayer Day. MSO plans to hold a meeting to pray for AMCF ministry and the World Conference 2024 with the members of MSO and other military mission-related organizations at the Armed Forces Central Military Chapel at 10:30am, October 28.
