

MSO extends a heartfelt appreciation to her members and her supporters who are carrying out our Lord's Great Commission in their global military ministerial works. Below are the MSO's October reports:

1 2023 FMF-K Interaction to Be Conducted On-line and Off-line

Starting in 2021, MSO has been conducting the FMF-K interaction program by inviting foreign soldiers receiving education at military schools in Korea. The purpose of this program is to improve the faith of participants and to train them as leaders of the National MCFs so that they can carry out MCF ministries after returning to their home countries.

The Interaction will be conducted online for two Saturdays, October 7th and October 14th, and face-to-face at Myungsung Academy House in Jeju for two days, October 21st and October 22nd.

The number of participants is 88, including 40 trainees from 15 countries and 48 of their families. MSO provides 25 instructors and support personnel.

The four-day program, conducted online and face-to-face, includes the introduction to world military mission organizations, biblical ethics, leadership training, discipleship training, the developmental history of Korean military missionary ministry, national MCF activities around the world, family and children's programs, and cultural tours of Jeju Island.

2 2023 AMCF World Prayer Day to Be Observed on Oct 28 by the MSO

The AMCF has decided to observe October 28th, as designated by the AMCF President, as a day for the MCFs around the world to pray for the establishment and revitalization of national MCFs.

Accordingly, the MSO is to hold a World Prayer Day Prayer Meeting with MSO members and delegates of military mission-related organizations such as KMCF and KVMCF at the Central Military Chapel (CMC) on October 28 from 10:30 to 14:00, with the first part being a service/prayer meeting and the second part, lunch/communion. The sermon of the service will be delivered by Pastor Kim, Eunsoo, head of the Middle East Team. The participants will pray for the AMCF, for the country of Korea and its military, and for the MSO during the prayer meeting.

In particular, during the meeting, a special donation will be raised for the MMI of the UK, which has recently been experiencing financial difficulties, and pray together for the smooth preparation and successful hosting of the AMCF World Conference 2024 (Oct 16~19) to be held in Brazil next year.

3 MSO Delegation Attended in ACCTS Staff meeting

From October 1 to 6, a MSO delegation participated in the US ACCTS Staff meeting. MSO has dispatched a delegation to this meeting every year to promote mutual cooperation among AMCF's Principal Support Organizations (PSOs).

This year, Secretary General Yang, Byung-hee, and Mission Director Choi, Nag-jung attended to report on MSO's latest ministry activities and share preparations for the AMCF Brazilian World Conference 2024. In addition, in response to the ACCTS' request, AMCF badges produced by MSO were delivered to the ACCTS, which will be awarded to participants of the Central American Regional Conference (Oct 25-26/Paraguay).
