1 Successful completion of FMF-K (Foreign Military Fellowship in Korea) 2023 interaction

The FMF-K 2023 Interaction Program, which aims to train Military Christian Fellowship (MCF) leaders by inviting foreign soldiers receiving consignment training at military schools in Korea, has ended.

The FMF-K interaction was conducted online for two days (October 7, October 14) at each school church and face-to-face for two days (October 21-22) on Jeju Island. 37 soldiers and cadets from 15 countries from 6 institutions including Korea Defense Language Institute, Korea National Defense University, Military Staff College, Air University, Naval War College, and Korea Military Academy participated and completed interaction training.

In the face-to-face training conducted in Jeju, 48 military families of trainees also participated in worship, Mom's & Kid's Program, graduation ceremony, and cultural tour programs. Foreign officers and cadets who completed the training gained not only personal faith but also a foundation for serving as MCF leaders in their home countries after returning home.

In Korea, it was conducted at the Central Military Chapel from 10:30 to 13:30 on Saturday, October 28, hosted by MSO.

From October 2nd to 6th, ACCTS Staff Meeting was held in White Sulfur Springs, Pennsylvania. Every year, MSO participates as a cooperative ministry of 3PSO. This year, Secretary General Yang, Byunghee and Mission Director Choi, Nagjung participated as MSO representatives, introducing MSO's recent ministry activities and sharing information necessary for global military mission, including interpretation technology. ACCTS also announced that new Executive Director (U.S. Navy Reserved Captain Terry and Susan Wichert) have been elected and will begin their term in March 2024.

B. Lieutenant Wandera, a Ugandan Christian soldier who suffered a severe facial gunshot wound, returned home after receiving treatments in Korea

On 6 September 2022, Lieutenant Jude Wandera, the Ugandan Christian Army officer, suffered a serious gunshot wound to the face while two of his comrades were killed during a battle with a Ugandan terrorist group.

He was between life and death due to excessive bleeding, but was able to save his life by undergoing emergency surgery at a Ugandan military hospital. MSO East Africa

Team Leader Yoon Moonsoo heard this news while visiting Uganda and coordinated to give him free surgery at Yonsei University Medical School Severance Hospital with the help of the Severance Hospital social work team and at the invitation of MSO.

He underwent the first surgery from 25 June to 3 July, and revisited Korea from 6 to 27 October, completed the second surgery and treatment, and returned to Uganda on October 28. Team leader Yoon Moonsoo said, "We are so thankful that Lieutenant Wandera received treatment well and was able to recover. Lieutenant Wandera said, "the treatment I got in Korea was possible because of the love and dedication of many people." Lieutenant Wandera confessed that he had a passionate experience with God through the accident. He said, "I wondered why God gave me such a big ordeal and accident. He believes that this probably means spreading the gospel within the Ugandan military. He said, "My goal is to return to Uganda and share the testimony of my survival and the word of God to other soldiers and bring them back to the Lord."

C. East Central Asia Vision Prayer Meeting for WC 2024 (Online)

AMCF East and Central Asia Region vision prayer meeting will be held on 11 November 2023 to share information on the WC 2024 and identify participants from each country, hosted by Pastor Chung Bongdae, Vice President of ECA. MCF Presidents and Leaders from Taiwan, Japan, Mongolia, South Korea, Kyrgyzstan, Kazakhstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan will participate. The prayer meeting will be conducted in the following order: devotion, WC 2024 plan report, confirmation of participants from each country and ministry activity report, and discussion of future schedules. The East Central Asia Vision Prayer Meeting will be held every two months to prepare for and successfully host the WC 2024, and it has been decided to develop MSO support and sponsorship plans so that representatives from countries with weak MCF activities in the Asian region can also participate in the WC 2024.

D. Participation in South African Interaction (TMTI: Table Mountain Top Interaction)

South Africa Interaction, which will be held in Cape Town, South Africa from November 16th to 24th, is a program to train young Christian military leaders in Africa, hosted by the South African Regional Vice President and the South African MCF. Elder Lee Hyunchul, Southwest Africa team leader, and Elder Lee Jangsong, deputy director of the World Mission Bureau of MSO, are expected to participate and further revitalize 3PSO cooperative ministries through MSO introduction and fellowship activities.

4 KVMCF/KMCF Joint Breakfast Service and Military Mission-related Organizations Cooperation Meeting Held

On November 1st, a Metropolitan area joint breakfast service was held at the Central Military Church hosted by the Korea Military Christian Fellowship (KMCF). MSO Standing Vice Chairman Pastor Chung Bongdae prayed for God, for the country, and for the military in difficult situations at home and abroad. In the sermon, Pastor Lee Changhee, who is in charge of military service at the 5th Armored Brigade Church, shared news of his activities in front-line military service and said that as a Christian soldier, "love is a blessing" and that we should live a life of with Jesus. At the related organizations cooperation meeting, news of each organization's activities were shared.
