1 Education and Training Bureau Dedication Service Held

On March 28, the MSO Education and Training Bureau dedication service was held at the Gideon Chapel of the Central Military Chapel (CMC) with the first part being a worship and prayer meeting, the second part being the Education and Training Bureau ministry report, and the third part being communion and fellowship.

In the first part, the service and prayer meeting, an MSO Advisory Pastor Son, Chang-moon delivered a sermon titled by "Come and See," with the hope that all of MSO's education will be an experience-based education and training in that the participants come directly to the ministry sites and learn from the experience just as Apostles Philip and Andrew did. He also requested the dedication of all members of the Education and Training Bureau.

In the second part, ministry report, Col Lee, Jang-song, the director of the Education and Training Bureau, focused on balanced development of all MSO education and training programs in 2024 and cultivating human resources to continuously and passionately carry out global military missionary ministries. In addition, in commemoration of the 20th anniversary of the implementation of MEO-P, one of the representative educational programs of MSO, he proposed a seminar to review the achievements so far and seek alternatives to continue to develop as one of the main educational programs of the AMCF, which cultivates talents dedicated to world military missions. Col Lee also suggested to actively promote the development program instructors and subjects.

Next, Kang, Thomas Tae, an MSO Missionary to the CIS countries, presented a plan to revitalize fostering activities in these countries, receiving a great response from the audience.

2 A Cornelius Discipleship Training Held in Country "A" & "B"

The 2024 Cornelius Discipleship Training was graciously conducted with instructors and budget support from MSO for 4 days each, with 33 Christian soldiers from Country "A" participating from February 20th to 23rd, and 34 from Country "B" from March 12th to 15th.

Many new Christian soldiers attended this Cornelius Discipleship Training, which served as an opportunity to revitalize MCFs there.

In the future, Cornelius Discipleship Training will expand online education in "B" country and Cambodia, and MSO is now developing a plan to support mobile phone devices to enable online education in "A" country, where online education is limited due to the lack of these devices.

3 A Group of Missionaries to America Visited MSO

On March 21, four missionaries to the American Regions, including Agape Manna Chairman Dr. Mun, Dae-yeon, Pastor Lim, Cheol-bin, Pastor Kim, Hyeong-min, Elder Seok, Sa-hyeon visited MSO.

At MSO, former AMCF President General Lee, Pil-sup, MSO Chairman General Park, Nam-pil, AMCF Vice President for East & Central Asia Region Pastor Chung, Bong-dae attended to introduce AMCF/MSO and discuss global military missionary ministry activities. Cooperation measures in missionary activities in the Americas were also discussed.



4 A HMS Crew Member Visited Korean Naval MCF and Shared Fellowship

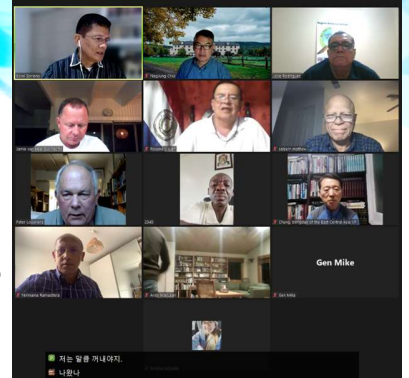

This fellowship was arranged through Mr. Mark Hibbert-Hingston of MMI, who asked MSO to greet him as a brother.



5 AMCF Ministries

a. AMCF Watch & Prayer Meeting(Online)

On March 20th, a prayer meeting was held to prepare for AMCF WC 2024, hosted by AMCF President Essel Soriano. From MSO, East & Central Asia VP Chung, Bong-dae and MSO Mission Director Choi, Nag-jung attended. The attendees prayed for Brazil and the Brazilian church, for the World Conference 2024, and for Christian soldiers around the world. They also prayed that peace would come as soon as possible through God's guidance in Ukraine and Israel, which are at war.



b. Asia South MCF Presidents' Meeting Held Online

On March 23, AMCF South Asia (Asia-S) VP Mr. Saleem Matthew hosted a prayer meeting with Asia-S MCF Presidents and 3PSO South Asia regional managers in attendance. From MSO, Asia-S Team Leader, Col Kim, Hyung-gon attended. In South Asia, Jungyoon Church, which sponsors MSO, decided to provide financial support to two Nepal MCF members and MSO to one Indian MCF member to participate in the AMCF World Conference 2024.



c. Middle East Team Leader's Prayer Meeting(Online)

On March 26, a Middle East regional meeting was held online, hosted by MMI Middle East Regional Cooperation Officer Mr. Richard Meryon, with delegates from the UK, Egypt, Lebanon, Jordan, Iraq, and Serbia, as well as MSO Middle East Team Leader, Col Key, Yong-ho. They shared the prayer topics of each country and prayed together that the war between Israel and Hamas would end quickly and that the war would not escalate further in the Middle East.

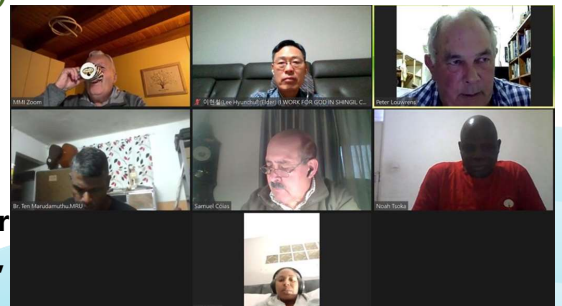
d. 3PSO Cooperation Meeting (online) to Discuss Financial Support to MCFs Wishing to Participate in the WC
