2024 MSO Annual General Meeting Held

The annual general meeting of the Mission Support Organization (MSO) was held on December 21 at the Central Military Chapel. A total of 45 MSO executives attended the event, which proceeded in three parts: Part 1 - Worship and Prayer Meeting, Part 2 - General Meeting, and Part 3 - Fellowship

During Part 1, the worship service, Pastor Son Chang-moon preached a message urging all members to dedicate themselves to and cooperate in the global military mission efforts. He encouraged everyone to pray and prepare for the 2025 global military mission activities with a heart of service and devotion.

In Part 2, the general meeting, Secretary General Yang Byung-hee presented the results of the 2024 mission activities and budget usage, as well as the plans for the 2025 mission activities and budget. The assembly approved these reports, and Elder Lee Seung-jin was elected as the new auditor to serve a two-year term.

Through this annual general meeting, MSO finalized its preparations for the 2025 global military mission efforts, marking a new beginning for its ministry.





2024 Year-End Worship Service (Online)

On December 26, the MSO held its year-end worship service to conclude the year before God. In his sermon, Pastor Kim Jong-su expressed gratitude to God for expanding the boundaries of global military mission activities in 2024 and encouraged everyone to live as ultimate victors in Christ.



All members who participated in the year-end worship service prayed for the Republic of Korea, currently facing challenging times, to swiftly regain stability and achieve peace.

3 2025 MSO New Year Worship Service

On January 2, the MSO held its New Year Worship Service at the Rev. Han Kyung-jik Hall within the Yanghwajin Foreign Missionary Cemetery. The cemetery is the final resting place for 145 foreign missionaries and their families who devoted their lives to the Korean people during the late Joseon Dynasty and the Japanese colonial period, along with others, bringing the total to 417 individuals currently buried there.

Since 2005, MSO members have been fulfilling their global missionary calling as debtors to the Gospel. In his sermon, Rev. Lee Kwang-soon (Chairman of The Light Mission) encouraged MSO members, saying, "In 2025, let this be a year where all MSO members commit to revitalizing and protecting the Korean Church while identifying those who will carry out the global military mission."

Elder Park Nam-pil (MSO Chairman) delivered a New Year greeting, urging members to "pray for the stability of the nation and the advancement of global military missions."

In 2025, MSO members remain committed to establishing Military Christian Fellowships (MCFs) in all nations, fostering the growth and activation of existing MCFs, and dedicating themselves to this mission under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.











AMCF Activities

a. 2024 WCON Pray & Plan Team Thanksgiving Meeting

On December 5, under the leadership of AMCF President Essel Soriano, a thanksgiving prayer meeting was held for the successful hosting of the 2024 World Conference.

The meeting was attended by AMCF Vice
Presidents, representatives from AMCF's Principal
Supporting Organizations (PSOs), and the Brazilian
Military Christian Fellowship (UMCEB). Representing

b. Southern Africa MIVIII Preparatory Team P&P (Online)

On December 12, under the leadership of AMCF Southern Africa Vice President Ramasitera, an online preparatory meeting for the Mauritius Mountain Top Interaction (MMTI) was held. The meeting included the participation of Military Christian Fellowship (MCF) presidents and leaders




from the Southern Africa region, as well as representatives from Principal Supporting Organizations (PSOs), including the UK MMI and Korea MSO.

Representing Korea MSO, Elder Lee Hyun-chul (Team Leader for Southwest Africa) attended the meeting. MSO committed to actively supporting the preparation for the 2025 MMTI to be held in Mauritius and to fostering the next generation of "Joshua leaders."

c. West Africa Prayer Meeting (Online)

On December 27, under the leadership of AMCF West Africa Vice President Mike

Akpatsu, an online prayer meeting was held for the West Africa region. The meeting included the participation of Military Christian Fellowship (MCF) presidents and leaders from the West Africa region, as well as representatives from Principal Supporting Organizations



(PSOs), including the UK MMI and Korea MSO. Representing Korea MSO, Elder Lee Hyun-chul (Southwest Africa Team Leader) attended the meeting. Participants expressed gratitude for the establishment of the Equatorial Guinea MCF in 2024 and prayed for the revitalization of MCFs in the West Africa region. They also committed to continued cooperation and prayer for the strengthening of national MCFs in West Africa in the new year of 2025.

d. AMCF East & Central Asia Vision Prayer Meeting (Online)

On January 4, under the leadership of East-Central Asia Vice President Rev. Chung Bong-dae, an online Vision Prayer Meeting was held. The meeting included participation from presidents and leaders of Military Christian Fellowships (MCFs) from six East & Central Asian countries, AMCF President Essel Soriano, representatives



from ACCTS (Rick Ryles), former U.S. Forces Korea Chaplain (Rev. Paul Buck), and from MSO: East-Central Asia Team Leader Ahn Dae-hee, Mission Director Choi Nak-jung, and Missionary Kang Tae-won.

The Vision Prayer Meeting featured New Year's greetings from the AMCF President, a presentation of the 2025 ministry vision by the East & Central Asia Vice President, and updates on ministry activities from each country's MCF president.

Key events for 2025 include the Stan-Dart Conference (July 10-12 in Almaty, Kazakhstan) and the East & Central Asia Interaction (October 17-19 in Tokyo, Japan). To prepare for these major initiatives, quarterly prayer meetings will be held throughout the year.

5 KVMCF/KMCF Joint Breakfast Service (January)

On January 8, Wednesday, at 5:30 AM, the KVMCF/KMCF Joint Breakfast Service was held at the main sanctuary of the Central Military Chapel to mark the beginning of 2025. The service was attended by over 200 participants, including members and associate members of MCF from the Ministry of National Defense, the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and units in the Seoul area, as well as members from KVMCF, MSO, and the congregation of the Korean Armed Forces Central Church.



In his sermon, Pastor Kim Young-seok, Senior Pastor of the Central Military Chapel, emphasized, "With the strength that God gives, we will maintain peace, and it will be a year for all KVMCF and KMCF members to thrive, following God's way, not the world's way."
