1 MSO New Year's Retreat Held

On November 18, MSO held its 2025 New Year's Retreat in the Central Military Chapel to discuss the direction and future vision of military missions. The event was attended by about 50 people, including MSO members, congregants of the Central Military Chapel, Korea Veteran Military Christian Fellowship (KVMCF), and Korea Military Christian Fellowship (KMCF).

The first part of the event was a worship service led by Vice President of the East-Central Asia Region, Chung Bong-dae. Pastor Yeon Kwang-kyu delivered a sermon emphasizing the vision of gospel-based unification of the Korean Peninsula and military missions.

In the second part, MSO's Standing Advisor, Elder Lee Kap-jin gave a special lecture on "Global Military Missions and MSO," emphasizing the importance of expanding military missions worldwide.

In the afternoon, a book summarizing MSO's ministry over the past 20 years was introduced. Through departmental meetings, the direction of the 2025 ministry was concretized. The participants reaffirmed their dedication and resolved to continue praying and taking action for the advancement of global military missions.

2 Central Military Chapel Conducts Military Mission Activities at Cambodian Special Forces Command

The military mission team of the Central Military Chapel conducted missionary activities at the Cambodian Special Forces Command from January 10 to 19. A total of 23 participants took part in this mission, offering various programs such as children's activities, Korean language, English, Nanta (Korean percussion performance), and medical missions.

Faith exchange and cultural introduction activities were conducted for local soldiers and their families, with support from Pastor Ko Young-sil. MSO also contributed by sponsoring 2 million KRW. The Central Military Chapel stated, "We will continue to expand overseas military missions."



3 Marine Corps International School English Bible Camp Held

The "Marine Corps Children's English Bible Camp" at the Marine Corps International School in Cambodia was successfully concluded, presenting a new model for overseas military missions. From January 11 to 19, a missionary team of three families (12 members) from a Korean church in Sydney, Australia, was dispatched. The camp was designed as a "family-centered mission," where parents and children participated together. It received great enthusiasm, with all students from the Marine Corps International School's English class taking part.

The camp centered on the theme "Who will be King?" and provided gospel-based English education through family role assignments. Additionally, in the evenings, the team visited local Christian families for prayer meetings.

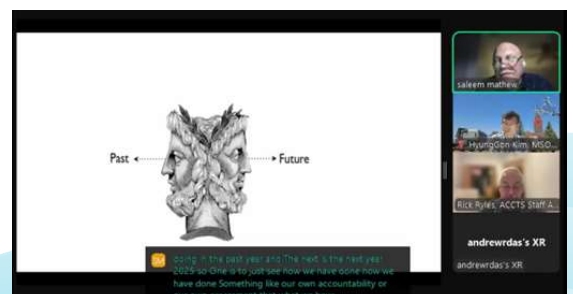
As a follow-up, plans were made to utilize Bible study materials and distribute Khmer-translated evangelical booklets. The mission team is committed to continuing follow-up ministries to support ongoing spiritual growth.



4 AMCF Activities

a. South Asia MCF Online Prayer Meeting Held

The South Asia Military Christian Fellowship (MCF) online prayer meeting was held on January 19, led by Saleem Mathew VP. The meeting was attended by South Asia MCF leaders, PSOs (ACCTS, MSO), and MSO South Asia Team Leader, Elder Kim Hyung-gon.



During the meeting, participants shared updates on South Asia mission activities and the MSO New Year's Retreat. They also agreed to continue holding regular online meetings every two months to strengthen cooperation among MCFs. These meetings will serve as a platform to review regional ministries and discuss mutual support strategies.

b. Middle East Online Prayer Meeting Held

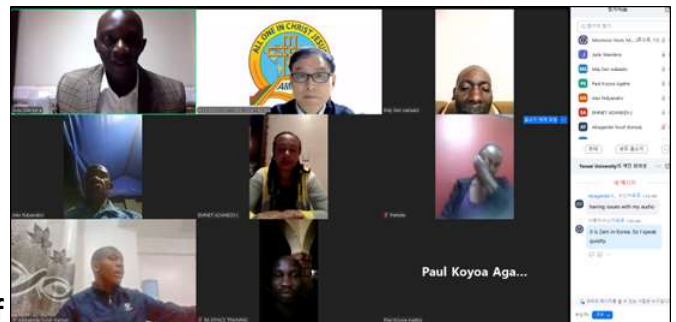
On January 28, an online prayer meeting for the Middle East region was held, attended by MMI Richard Meryon and his wife, Lebanese General Sami, and MSO missionary Paul Ko.



Participants prayed for the expansion of military gospel ministry among Egyptian Christian youth and the revitalization of Middle East MCF activities. They emphasized the need for continuous cooperation and support to help Christian communities maintain their faith despite challenging circumstances. Attendees reaffirmed their commitment to prayer and efforts for military missions in the Middle East.

c. East & Francophone Africa Online Prayer Meeting Held

In the early morning of January 29, an online prayer meeting for the East & Francophone Africa region was held, attended by 15 MCF leaders and MSO East and Francophone Africa Team Leader, Deacon Yoon Moon-soo.



Participants prayed for the establishment of MCF chapters and the foundation of military missions in Djibouti and Sudan. They also engaged in intercessory prayer for peace and stability in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and Somalia.

5 Appointment of New MSO Operations Director

As of February 1, Elder Kim Chan-soo has been appointed as the new Operations Director of MSO. Elder Park Baek-man, who stepped down for health reason, has dedicated himself to the development of global military missions through MSO, and we express our deep gratitude for his contributions.



Elder Kim Chan-soo will support the operation of MSO and be responsible for revitalizing global military mission work and strengthening collaboration with partner organizations.
