## 1 Cornelius Discipleship Training in Country V

From March 11 to 14, the Cornelius Discipleship Training was held in Country V. Although the training site was geographically ideal, participation was limited due to political and economic challenges. As a result, eight MCF members from four regional branches attended, along with two observers from M country.

Elder Lee Kap-jin, Missionary Lee Jae-yool, Deacon Choi Shin-il, and the MCF president of Country V served as instructors. Representatives from M country also shared updates on their local MCF ministry.

During the training, leaders from Country V discussed future plans for the Indochina Cornelius Discipleship Training in 2026, aiming to integrate leaders from other nations and adjust the program to regional contexts. The gathering fostered anticipation for renewed cooperation between the MCF of M country and MSO in 2026.

Future discipleship training sessions in Country V will be locally organized, with the MCF determining the appropriate timing and venue. MSO's Mission and Education Departments will work closely with regional MCF leaders to develop detailed plans.

The visit included Elder Lee Pil-sup (Standing Advisor, MSO), MSO Chairman Park Nam-pil, and Chung Bong-dae, Vice President of East and Central Asia.

Discussions focused on potential partnerships with the Foreign Workers' Mission, which ministers to workers from Mongolia, Vietnam, Iran, Türkiye, China, and the Philippines. This visit marked a meaningful step toward deeper mission collaboration and outreach.



### 4 Visit to Supporting Church – Missionary Thomas Kang

On March 9 (Sunday), Missionary Thomas Kang visited Shingil Church in Seoul, participating in worship and sharing his mission experiences. He spoke about the impact of the Russia-Ukraine war and the establishment of military chaplaincy.

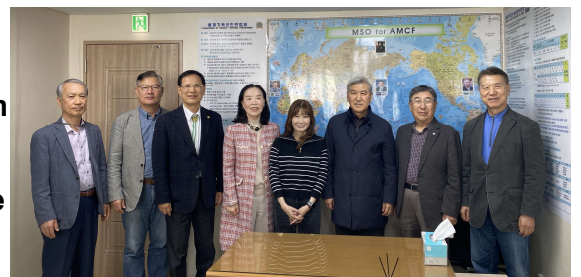

Her steadfast commitment deeply inspired the MSO community, reaffirming the importance of global military missions.

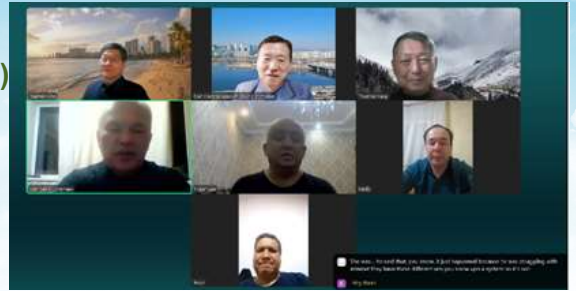




## 6 AMCF Activities

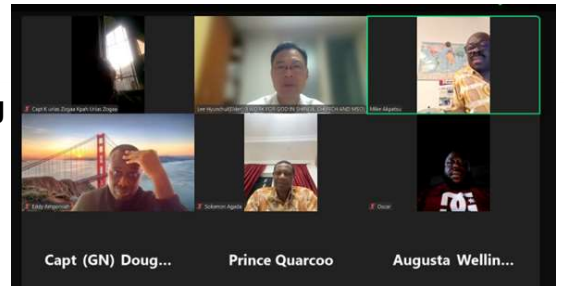
### a. Central Asia MCF Leaders' Prayer Meeting (Online)

Held on March 8 and presided over by Ulanbek, MCF President of Kyrgyzstan. Seven participants, including MCF presidents from four countries and regional leaders, gathered to share updates and pray together. The program included a devotional, national ministry reports, and a VP presentation, all conducted in Russian. This quarterly prayer meeting fosters unity and cooperation in Central Asia's military missions.



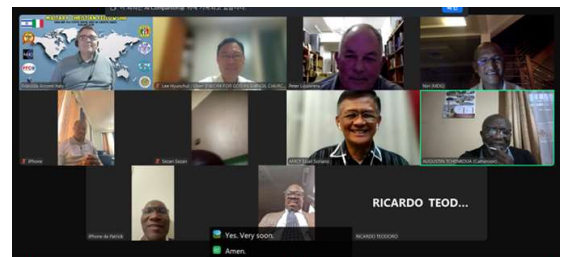
### b. West Africa MCF Leaders' Prayer Meeting (Online)

The West Africa MCF Presidents' Prayer Meeting was held online on Monday, March 10. The meeting was led by Mike Akpatsu, the Vice President of West Africa, and attended by a total of nine participants, including regional MCF presidents, MMI representatives, and MSO's South West Africa Team Leader, Lee Hyun-chul. The prayer meeting began with an opening prayer and a greeting from the Vice President, followed by prayers of thanksgiving (for Ghana and the U.S. elections), prayers for the vision and revival of MCF in West Africa, and prayers for peace in the Russia-Ukraine conflict and the Israel-Gaza region. During the discussion session, participants actively engaged in conversations regarding the Pan-African Conference, quarterly prayer meetings, and participant selection for the MEO program.



### c. AMCF Africa Region "Watch & Pray" (Online)

On March 13, the Africa region "Watch & Pray" meeting was held under the leadership of General Ramasitera, Vice President for Southern Africa. Eleven participants, including the AMCF President and MSO's South West Africa Team Leader, gathered for a time of prayer for the African nations and regional MCFs, and confirmed plans for the Pan-African Conference to be held in 2028.



### d. South Asia MCF Prayer Meeting (Online)

On March 22, the South Asia MCF Prayer Meeting was held online. The meeting was attended by the Vice President of the South Asia region, representatives of MCF from India and Bangladesh, and Elder Kim Hyung-gon, the MSO South Asia team leader. The prayer meeting began with an opening prayer, followed by discussions on the recommendation of participants for the



MEO program and the appointment of a regional vice president. Following this, prayers were offered for the participation of regional MCF representatives in the Zoom meeting, for the incoming vice president, and for missionaries and Christian believers facing persecution in the region.

**e. East and Francophone Africa MCF Prayer Meeting (Online)**

On March 26, the East and Francophone Africa MCF Prayer Meeting was held online. The meeting was attended by the Vice President of the East and Francophone Africa region, along with 6 MCF executives from Uganda and Kenya.

During the prayer meeting, heartfelt prayers were offered for the revival of MCF in East, Central, and Francophone Africa, ACCTS chaplain training, a peaceful election in Cameroon, preparations for the East and Central Asia regional conference, the establishment of MCF in South Sudan, and peace in the nations of the region.



**f. Passing of Former Uzbekistan MCF President Timur Kuldashiev**

On March 18, MSO expressed deep condolences upon hearing the news of the passing of Timur Kuldashiev, former president of Uzbekistan MCF. President Kuldashiev was a devoted servant of military missions and had a profound impact on many. His missionary work and dedication will be remembered forever. MSO prays for God's peace and comfort for his family and colleagues and plans to personally visit his bereaved family to offer condolences during the Stan-dart Conference in July.



## 7 KVMCF/KMCF Joint Breakfast Prayer Meeting

On March 5, the KVMCF/KMCF Joint Breakfast Prayer Meeting was held at the Central Military Chapel. Pastor Jeon Se-gwang (Light of the World Church) delivered a message titled "The Greatest in the Kingdom of the Lord," accompanied by a praise offering from the ROTC worship team.

Afterwards, a fellowship breakfast allowed attendees to connect and share in Christian fellowship, followed by a cooperation meeting among related organizations. This gathering was a blessed time of encouragement, reaffirming unity in God's grace.
