1 AMCF Annual Day of Prayer - United in Prayer for Global Military Evangelism

The 2025 AMCF (Association of Military Christian Fellowships) Annual Day of Prayer was held on Saturday, October 25, 2025 at the Gideon Chapel of the Central Military Chapel. About 40 participants attended, including representatives from KMCF (Korea Military Christian Fellowship) and KVMCF (Korea Veteran Military Christian Fellowship), as well as members of the Korean Armed Forces Elders' Association. Notably, a Peruvian Army Captain and a Ugandan government official joined the gathering, signifying to the spirit of global unity in military Christian fellowship.

The worship service began with a time of praise and worship, followed by an opening prayer, message, intercessory prayer, closing prayer, and benediction. Rev. Park Heung-Jae, Senior Pastor of the Central Military Chapel, delivered a sermon titled "The Great Commission." In his message, he emphasized that "military ministry is not merely the mission of one nation, but an act of obedience to God's command to transform the world through the Gospel."

After the sermon, participants earnestly prayed for the evangelization of military personnel around the world and for the revival of MCFs in each nation. The prayer segments included repentance and thanksgiving, prayer for AMCF, prayer for the nation and military, and prayer for MSO.

Following the prayer meeting, attendees shared a fellowship luncheon, encouraging one another in their respective ministries and reaffirming their commitment to continued partnership in global military evangelism.

2 2025 East & Central Asia Interaction Held in Tokyo, Japan

The 2025 East & Central Asia Interaction was held from October 17 to 19, 2025, at Ushigome Christ Church in Tokyo, Japan, under the theme "The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not be in want" (Psalm 23:1).

A total of 40 participants from seven countries joined the event. Among them, 30 representatives from four nations attended in person — Korea (14), Taiwan (2), USA (2), and Japan (12) — while 10 participants from Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, the Philippines, and senior members in Japan joined online.

On Day 1, the program included an opening worship and fellowship time, greetings and prayer by the East & Central Asia Vice President, and an IBS/CP (Inductive Bible Study & Conversational Prayer) lecture and practice session led by Rick Ryle from ACCTS.

Day 2 featured lectures on biblical leadership and ethics, national MCF reports, East & Central Asia vision and ministry planning presentations, and personal testimonies.

Day 3 included sessions on MCF growth and IBS/CP practice, followed by a closing worship service and farewell luncheon.

The conference was conducted in accordance with the AMCF Reference Handbook guidelines and utilized a hybrid format (on-site and online via YouTube and Zoom) to enable broader participation. Offerings from the opening and closing worship services were dedicated to supporting under-resourced MCFs and the “Stan” countries. The main lecturers were Rick Ryle, ACCTS Asia Regional Coordinator, and Carson, ACCTS China Coordinator.

Preparation for the event began a month in advance, with IBS/CP team assignments and Bible passages distributed ahead of time to ensure thorough participation. The interaction strengthened unity among East and Central Asian MCFs, enhanced leadership capacity, and laid a foundation for greater self-sustainability and collaboration in military Christian ministry across the region.



3 MSO Central Asia Team Visits Uzbekistan and Kazakhstan - Preparing for the 2026 Stan-Dart Conference and Strengthening Military Ministry Cooperation

The MSO Central Asia Team visited Uzbekistan and Kazakhstan from October 10 to 16, 2025. The delegation included MSO field missionaries and East & Central Asia Team Leader Elder Ahn Dae-Hee, who met with local MCF (Military Christian Fellowship) leaders to discuss future cooperation in military ministry.

The primary purpose of the visit was to review the preparations for the upcoming 2026 Stan-Dart Conference, which the Uzbekistan MCF is organizing independently. The team also conducted on-site inspections of potential venues and assessed local church support and the need for additional MSO assistance. As the Uzbekistan MCF takes on the role of host for the 2026 event, MSO engaged in in-depth discussions about sustainable partnership and strategic support.

During the trip, the delegation met with the Uzbekistan MCF president and local church members, sharing fellowship and hearing updates on the progress of military ministry in the region. They then traveled to Kazakhstan, where They visited the church served by Captain (Ret.) Malik Idrissov and the church pastored by Rev. Vissarion Kim, both of which are actively involved in MCF ministry. There, they explored opportunities to expand cultural and spiritual exchanges through short-term programs such as K-Culture and Korean language classes.

This visit is expected to strengthen unity and self-sufficiency among Central Asian MCFs and enhance regional cooperation in military evangelism.

Finally, the MSO Central Asia Team requested continued prayer for the successful preparation and hosting of the 2026 Stan-Dart Conference by the Uzbekistan MCF, for the participation of countries that have faced challenges in attending, and for closer partnership with local churches. They also asked for intercession for Pastor P, chairman of the national church alliance, that his vision to establish a military ministry branch and nationwide Christian unity movement may be realized in God's time.

4 AMCF Ministry Activities

a. News of MCF Establishment in Serbia

MSO's partner organization in the United Kingdom, MMI (www.mmi.org.uk), announced the establishment of a MCF in Serbia (Southern and Central Europe) on October 3, 2025.

In sharing this joyful news, MMI gave thanks to God and expressed encouragement for the newly formed leaders and members of the Serbia MCF as they seek to bring the hope and love of Christ to more than 25,000 soldiers across the nation. MMI also requested prayer that the Serbia MCF would be guided by God's divine wisdom and faithfully fulfill the mission entrusted to them.



b. East & Central Asia MCF Vision Prayer Meeting Held Online

The East & Central Asia (ECA) MCF Vision Prayer Meeting was held online on Saturday, October 4, 2025. The meeting brought together a total of 15 participants, including MCF presidents from various countries, the ECA Vice President, ACCTS representatives, East & Central Asia



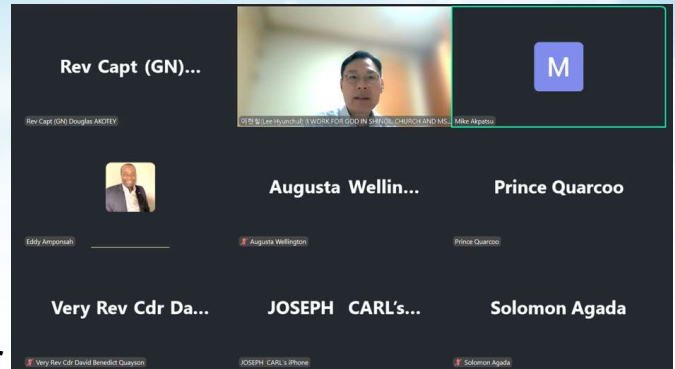
Deputy Team Leader Bang Se-Gyeong, Rev. Kim Sang-Chul, and MSO field missionaries. The prayer meeting began with an opening prayer by Deputy Team Leader Bang Se-Gyeong, followed by a message delivered by Rev. Paul Buck, President of CTS Theological Seminary. Afterward, national MCF representatives shared their fourth-quarter ministry reports and updates, fostering mutual encouragement and fellowship.

During the intercessory prayer time led by an MSO missionary, participants prayed earnestly for the Japan East & Central Asia Interaction, the AMCF World Day of Prayer on October 25, and the preparations for the 2026 Regional Conference and Stan-Dart Conference. A key outcome of the meeting was the agreement to have Rick Ryle, ACCTS Asia Regional Coordinator, take the lead in developing detailed plans and scheduling for the 2026 Regional Conference.

The meeting concluded with a shared commitment and prayer that "the MCFs of each nation will unite to fulfill the vision of evangelizing Asia together."

c. Prayer Meeting Held for the 2028 Pan Africa Conference
- “May the Glory of God Cover the Continent of Africa”

On Monday, October 27, 2025, a special online prayer meeting was held in preparation for the 2028 Pan Africa Conference. The gathering was led by Brigadier General (Ret) Mike Akpatsu, Vice President for West Africa, and attended by nine participants, including Lee Hyun-Chul, MSO Southwest Africa Team Leader.



During the meeting, participants united their hearts in prayer for spiritual revival and restoration throughout the African continent. They lifted up prayers for spiritual awakening, God’s wisdom and strategic vision, and greater unity and cooperation among nations. They also prayed that God would raise righteous and wise leaders and bring peace, security, and stability to every region of Africa. Intercession continued for protection from violence and extremism, preservation of the environment against destruction and exploitation, economic recovery and prosperity, and the empowerment and education of the younger generation. They also prayed that the Church and AMCF would stand as a light to the world, bearing witness to God’s truth and love. The prayer meeting concluded with worship and praise, as all participants joined in one spirit, asking that the 2028 Pan Africa Conference would become more than just an event—a historic movement of revival through which the glory of God would cover the entire African continent.

5 MSO Cooperative Missionaries’ Ministry Activities

a. Unstoppable Devotion Amid Poverty - The Mission Story of the Karen Church in Myanmar
(Mission Report by Missionary Oh Young-Chul following his visit to the Pathein District)

On October 21, 2025, Missionary Oh Young-Chul shared a moving report about the Karen Church leaders in Pathein, Myanmar, who, despite the hardships of civil war and poverty, have shown extraordinary faith by offering more than their monthly wages to support the construction of a hospital. Confessing that “It is God who feeds and clothes us,” the Karen Church continues to dedicate itself wholeheartedly to mission and evangelism.



Missionary Oh remarked, “Their lives reminded me of the early church described in the Book of Acts,” emphasizing that “the driving force of missions is not money, but the power of God.”

b. “Adria Interaction” Military Ministry Conference in Croatia - Laying the Foundation for New Leadership and Expansion (Ministry Report by Missionary Kim Kyung-Keun)

Missionary Kim Kyung-Keun reported that, through the prayers and support of his partners, the “Adria Interaction” Military Ministry Conference held in Croatia was concluded with great grace and blessing.

The event served to deepen relationships with local ministry leaders and broaden fellowship with MMI members, strengthening the sense of unity among those engaged in military Christian service.

Missionary Kim shared, "This meeting provided an opportunity to understand one another more deeply and to lay a stronger foundation for future cooperation." Following the conference, Adria Interaction is now poised for further growth and renewal under new leadership.



Rev. Grozdan Dimitrov Stoevski from Bulgaria, Europe Regional Team Leader, MMI expressed his heartfelt hope, saying, "I pray that this conference will unite even the Balkan nations that once pointed their guns at each other through the power of the Gospel."

Missionary Kim added, "May this hope become reality, and may the peace of the Gospel spread throughout the Balkans."

It is expected that military ministry in Croatia will be further strengthened as a result of this conference, and that continued intercession and partnership from fellow workers will play a vital role in the ongoing expansion of the ministry.



KVMCF/KMCF Joint Breakfast Worship Service

On October 15, a Joint Prayer Breakfast was held at the Central Military Chapel, co-hosted by the Korea Veterans' MCF (KVMCF) and the Korea MCF (KMCF). Members from the Ministry of National Defense, Joint Chiefs of Staff, and Seoul Metropolitan Area MCF, along with representatives from KVMCF, MSO, and the church congregation, gathered to share a blessed time of worship and fellowship.

Rev. Jung Dong-Kyun of Seoul Nambu Church delivered a sermon titled "Wisdom from the Bible." He emphasized that "when the community of faith is armed with God's wisdom, the ministry of military evangelism will stand even stronger."

Following the service, participants shared in a time of fellowship, exchanging updates on their respective ministries and discussing ways to strengthen cooperation among related organizations.
