1 MSO World Military Ministry Thanksgiving Service and Ministry Report

The 2025 World Military Ministry Thanksgiving Service and MSO Ministry Report presentation took place on Sunday, November 9, in the Central Military Chapel. Ministers and believers serving in military ministry at home and abroad gathered to reflect on the year's work and give glory to God.

The service began under the leadership of Elder Chul-soo Lim, followed by a Representative Prayer from Pastor Chang-jae Kim, who prayed for wider doors for the Gospel through military ministry. Pastor Heung-jae Park, senior pastor of the Central Military Chapel, delivered a sermon titled "The Keys of the Kingdom" (Matthew 16:13-19), emphasizing that military ministry is a core mission the Korean church must fulfill for the world.

After the sermon, the MSO Chairman presented the annual ministry report, highlighting regional activities, MCF exchanges, outcomes of the MEO Program, and FMF-K Interaction. Participants shared gratitude and encouragement for the continued expansion of global military ministry. The MSO leadership offered a special song, hymn 505 "For the Whole World", reaffirming their commitment to serve the nations with the Gospel.

After the service, a fellowship reception followed, where attendees enjoyed time of sharing and ministry exchange. They expressed that it was "a meaningful occasion to reaffirm a new vision for military ministry."

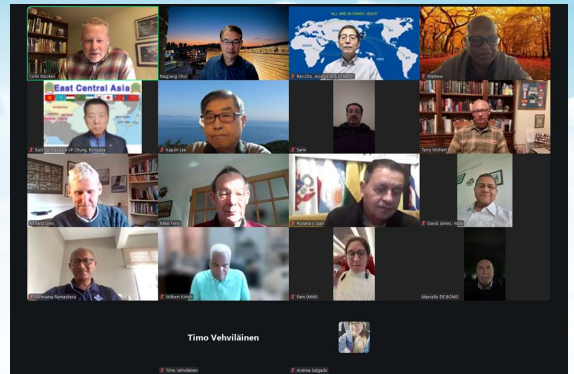
2 P&P Meeting Held for the Preparation of the 2026 AMCF Leaders Interaction

On November 24, 2025, AMCF held an online Pray & Plan (P&P) meeting to prepare for the "2026 AMCF Leaders Interaction (ALI 2026)." A total of 21 participants attended, including the AMCF President, 13 Regional Vice Presidents, and representatives from the three Principal Supporting Organizations (PSOs). From MSO, Elder Kap-jin Lee, Secretary General Jeong-il Cho, and Mission Director Nag-jung Choi officially participated.

During the meeting, the implementation plan for the successful operation of ALI 2026 was presented, followed by discussions on several key agenda items. The basic direction—aimed at strengthening global leadership and expanding cooperation among member nations—was shared, along with a review of the proposed revision of the AMCF Handbook and ways to utilize it for leadership training in line with the current environment.

Since changes in some Regional Vice Presidents are expected, the group also discussed including an official commissioning ceremony in the ALI 2026 program. Additionally, participants agreed to introduce regular regional strategy reviews to develop context-specific strategies for each area.

At the conclusion of the meeting, attendees expressed high expectations, noting that “ALI 2026 will be an important milestone in strengthening the unity and vision of the AMCF leadership.”



3 South Africa MMTI Held in Mauritius...

27 Emerging Christian Military Leaders from 11 Countries Trained

From November 20 to 28, 2025, the Mauritius Mountain Top Interaction (MMTI), a leadership development program for Christian military personnel in the South Africa region, was held in Port Louis (Tombeau Bay), Mauritius. The event was hosted by the South Africa Regional Vice President and supported by the three PSOs—MMI (UK), ACCTS (USA), and MSO (Korea). A total of 27 representatives from 11 South African countries, including Mozambique, participated in the intensive training designed to raise the next generation of Christian military leaders. From MSO, Elder Hyun-chul Lee (Southwest Africa Team Leader) and Elder Hyung-gon Kim (Interaction Team Leader) participated as instructors.

The program, aimed at providing “the best Christian experience to remember for a lifetime,” focused on spiritual growth and practical leadership development. Participants strengthened their capabilities as junior leaders for their national military ministries through holistic training that included Inductive Bible Study & Conversational Prayer (IBS/CP), Biblical Ethics and Leadership, and Physical and Mental Eevelopment. Activities such as hiking and Prayer Walks effectively integrated physical conditioning with spiritual formation.

Throughout the event, attendees engaged in a variety of activities—praise and prayer, Christian ethics sessions, testimonies, discipleship training, local church visits, and a Marriage Conference—building deep fellowship and sharing renewed vision.

This year’s MMTI is regarded as an international training program that offered an integrated approach to spirituality, leadership, ethics, and practical skills for emerging Christian military leaders in the South Africa region. Participants expressed that it was “a training experience they will remember for a lifetime,” and expectations are high for continued growth and transformation within the military ministries of their respective countries.

4 Appointment of Rev. Jeong-il Cho as the New MSO Secretary General

His fluency in English and experience in overseas missions are expected to make a significant contribution to the MSO ministry.



5 Visit to the MSO Office

a. Visit by Former USFK Chief Chaplain

On November 18, Rev. Samuel Lee, former Chief Chaplain of the United States Forces Korea (USFK), visited MSO. Rev. Lee, currently serving as the Director of Chaplaincy for the Southern Baptist Convention in the United States, came to Korea to encourage and support U.S. military chaplains stationed here.

During the visit, East & Central Asia Regional Vice President Bong-dae Chung and the MSO Operations Director attended the meeting and briefed him on MSO's major ministry activities. Rev. Lee expressed deep appreciation for the dedication to overseas military ministry and offered words of encouragement.



b. Visit by Undergraduate Students of Methodist Theological University

On November 19, Professor Yong-jin Yoon and ten undergraduate students from Methodist Theological University visited MSO. The students, many of whom will become future pastors and missionaries, watched an introductory MSO video and received a briefing on MSO's mission.

Through the session, the students gained a deeper understanding of the importance of military ministry, as well as the practical challenges and vision of field work. During the following Q&A time, they showed great interest and enthusiasm for military missions.



6 AMCF Ministry Activities

a. East Asia Joint Online Prayer Meeting Held

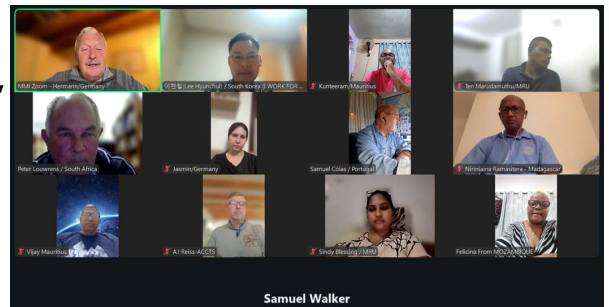
On November 8, the East Asia Prayer Meeting for November was held online under the leadership of Korea KMCF. Eleven participants, including Elders Hyung-gon Kim and Nam-ki Chung, joined the 70-minute gathering. The East & Central Asia Regional Vice President delivered a message, encouraging the dedication of those serving in military ministry. Participants shared updates from the Mongolia, Japan, and Korea MCFs and continued



intercessory prayer for each nation. They prayed for the spiritual fruit of Mongolia's National Defense University "Study with Success" training, for Japan's 2025 Interaction activities, and for Korea's preparation for the 2026 East & Central Asia Regional Conference. The group also discussed Korea KMCF's request to send official invitation letters for the Seoul conference, and they prayed for ACCTS representative Rick Ryles and his ministry visits to Nepal and Taiwan. The meeting concluded with strengthened unity and cooperation among Christian military members across East Asia.

b. Awakening the Dawn in Prayer for the South Africa MMTI

In the early hours of November 12, a special "Intensive Prayer Meeting" was held to lift up the Mauritius Mountain Top Interaction (MMTI), a military ministry training program for the South Africa region. The gathering was led by Major General (Ret.) Nirinianina Ramasitera, the South Africa Regional Vice President, and was attended by 16 participants, including Elder Hyun-chul Lee from MSO.

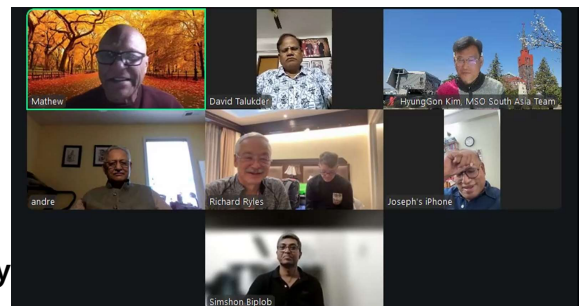


During this time of earnest intercession, the group offered heartfelt thanks to God for His guidance, prayed for the safe travels of all participants, and lifted up every aspect of the upcoming MMTI program. They also prayed for strong spiritual protection against any interference or attacks from the enemy.

This early-morning prayer meeting became a significant moment of spiritual empowerment, providing strength and covering for the field as they prepared for the training ahead.

c. South Asia MCF Leaders Share Ministry Vision in Online Meeting

At midnight on November 15, South Asia MCF leaders held an online Zoom meeting under the leadership of South Asia Regional Vice President Saleem Mathew. The meeting opened with a prayer and a meditation for November ("Thanksgiving, Remembrance, and Preparation"), followed by lively discussions centered on ministry updates from each country.



Rick Ryles and Jason from ACCTS shared news about the 20th anniversary celebration and seminar of the Nepal MCF (NPMCF), giving thanks together for the fruit God has produced through the ministry. Newly appointed Bangladesh MCF President, Brigadier General David, introduced himself to the participants and presented his vision for future ministry. In addition, the new General Secretary, Lt Cdr Simshon, testified about the insights and grace God had given him during challenging times, leaving a deep impression on the attendees.

Elder Hyung-gon Kim, South Asia Team Leader of MSO, requested intercessory prayer for the upcoming IBS/CP training to be held during MMTI. Finally, ACCTS' Rick Ryle led the closing prayer, concluding the meeting with renewed unity and vision.

Middle East Ministry Update: Pastor Mario's Recent News and Growing Expectations for United Ministry

– Prayer Request for Safe Delivery Amid Flourishing Ministry in Country A

According to missionary Ko Paul, recent news has been shared regarding Pastor Mario, who is leading a thriving youth and young adult ministry in Country A of the Middle East and contributing significantly to the revival of the local church. Pastor Mario has continued his fellowship with MSO even after completing the MEO program and requested prayer for the safe delivery for his wife, who is expecting their child in November.

He also asked for intercessory prayer so that young believers serving in the military may remain steadfast in their faith and continue worship. He noted that he plans to hold another military ministry vision meeting in early December. In addition, he was invited to a gathering of youth ministry leaders from evangelical denominations, where he will share the vision of military ministry and discuss possibilities for nationwide cooperation.

Meanwhile, expectations are growing for greater unity and synergy in ministry, as Richard Meryon, the MMI Middle East Team Leader, and Brigadier General (Ret.) Sami from Lebanon are scheduled to visit Country A on December 5.

Pastor Mario expressed deep gratitude for MSO's dedication and shared his desire to grow as a key partner in military ministry. He also requested continued prayer for a fresh wind of the Holy Spirit to move powerfully throughout the Middle East region.

KVMCF/KMCF Joint Breakfast Worship Service

On November 5, a joint breakfast service was held in the main sanctuary of the Korea Armed Forces Central Church, hosted by the Korea Veterans' Military Christian Fellowship (KVMCF) and the Korea Military Christian Fellowship (KMCF).

More than 150 participants—including representatives from the Ministry of National Defense, the Joint Chiefs of Staff, the Metropolitan Area MCFs, KVMCF, MSO, as well as church members—gathered to share unity and vision for military missions.

Rev. Kyu-yong Lee of Gireum Peace Church delivered the message, preaching under the title "Let Nothing Be Wasted" (John 6:8–15). He emphasized the importance of valuing even the small things and using them for God's purposes.

Following the service, attendees enjoyed fellowship and took part in informal discussions among related organizations, exploring ways to strengthen cooperation in military ministry.
