1 The MSO Education and Training Bureau Dedication Service was held.

On February 26, the MSO Education and Training Bureau Dedication Service was held both in-person and online at the Gideon Chapel of the Central Military Chapel. A total of 44 people participated, including 20 in person and 24 online.

The service began with the presiding of Elder Lee Jang-song, Director of the Education and Training Bureau. Following the prayer by Elder Cho Soon-keun, Director of the Education Office, Rev. Jeon Sung-dong delivered the sermon based on 2 Timothy 2:1–2 under the title, "The Calling to Equip and Raise Disciple"

In his message, he emphasized that the gospel ministry is a sacred mission of spiritual multiplication passed down from Paul to Timothy, to faithful people, and then to others. He also stressed the importance of disciple-training ministry that strengthens believers in grace and raising faithful stewards to preserve the legacy for the next generation.

This was followed by a united prayer and the weekly ministry report. The Director of the Education and Training Bureau also presented the ministry plans of the bureau.

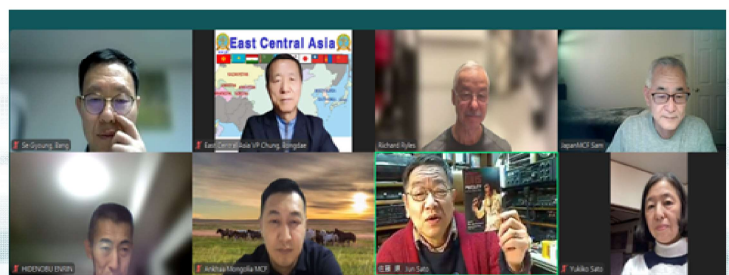

2 AMCF Activities

a. East Asia Four Nations Vision Prayer Meeting Held

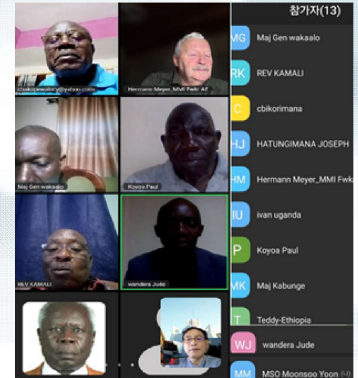
The East Asia Four Nations Vision Prayer Meeting was held online on February 7, 2026, with eight participants including the ECA Vice President, East Asia Team Leader, ACCTS, Mongolia MCF, and Japan JMCf. Participants shared ministry updates and prayer requests from each country and received an ECA ministry report.



It was reported that Taiwan MCF has grown to about 20 members, and participation in the Japan MCF online prayer meeting is increasing. A report was also given on Rick Ryles (ACCTS)'s recent ministry visit to Asia, and a request was made for visa cooperation for Mongolia MCF participants for the upcoming East & Central Asia Regional Conference.

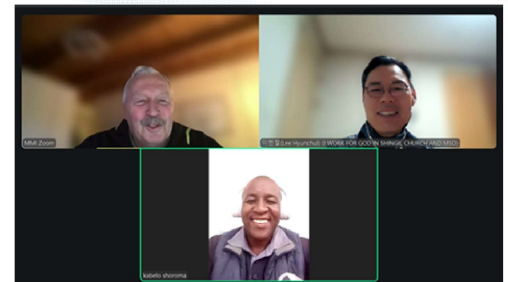
b. Pray & Plan (P&P) Meeting for East Africa Regional Conference

An online Pray & Plan (P&P) meeting for the East Africa Regional Conference was held on February 11, led by AMCF Vice President Gen. Wakaalo. Participants included representatives from AMCF, ACCTS, MMI, regional MCF leaders, and MSO. During the meeting, participants shared gratitude for the financial support and reported that about 90% of the preparations are complete, with around 100 participants expected from several East African countries.



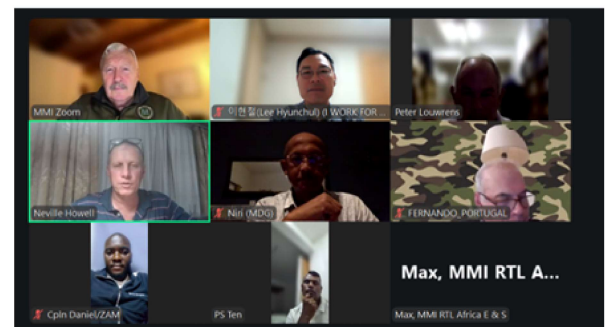
c. Southern Africa MCF Prayer Meeting

An online Southern Africa MCF prayer meeting was held on February 12, led by Col. (Ret.) Herman of MMI, with participants from South Africa MCF and MSO. Participants prayed for the revival of MCF in each country, the leadership of MCF presidents, and the preparation of the 2026 Table Mountain Top Interaction (TMTI). It was also shared that Col. Herman plans to hand over the ministry to Maj. (Ret.) Max Mupondi this year.



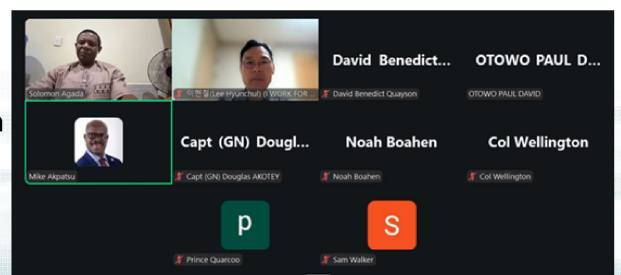
d. South Africa 2026 Table Mountain Top Interaction (TMTI) Preparation

A Pray & Plan meeting for the 2026 Table Mountain Top Interaction (TMTI) was held online on February 19 with nine participants from AMCF, MCF, MMI, and MSO. Participants discussed the dates, venue, budget, speakers, and program, and considered the participation of next-generation Christian military leaders from 14 countries. They also agreed to continue monthly united prayer meetings for the preparation of the TMTI.



e. West Africa MCF Prayer Meeting

The West Africa MCF prayer meeting was held online on February 23, led by AMCF West Africa Vice President Gen. Akpatsu, with participants from Ghana, Nigeria, and MSO. Participants prayed for the preparation of the 2028 Pan-Africa Conference, the revival of military mission in West Africa, and for the leadership and ministry conditions of MCF in each country. The next prayer meeting will be held on March 31.



3 AMCF East & Central Asia Regional Conference 2026 Preparation Meeting

A preparation meeting for the 2026 AMCF East & Central Asia Regional Conference was



held on February 12 at the Central Military Chapel. Representatives from the Chaplains Corps, MEAK, KVMCF, the Military Christian Women's Association, and MSO attended, and MSO shared the conference plan and requested cooperation.

The conference will be held September 16–19 at the Central Military Chapel and a youth

hostel, with about 100 participants expected, including 50 from 11 countries in East and Central Asia and 50 from Korea. Invitations to the AMCF President and leaders from ACCTS and MMI are also being considered. The program will include registration, worship services, country reports, IBS/CP sessions, lectures, and a cultural tour, ending with a closing worship service before participants return to their countries.

The meeting helped participating organizations share the conference plan and strengthen cooperation, expecting to further promote unity and fellowship in military mission in East and Central Asia.

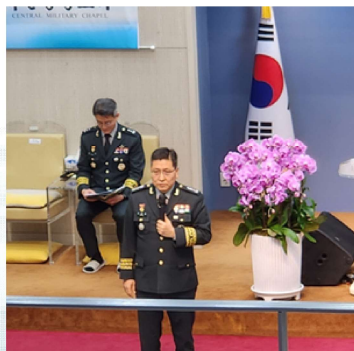
4 Korea Military Christian Fellowship (KMCF) Activities
