MSO World Mission Bureau Celebrates Dedication Service

The MSO World Mission Bureau held its dedication service on March 28 at the Central Military Chapel, with around 40 participants in attendance. This in-person gathering served as a sacred opportunity to re-ignite the passion for military evangelism.

The first session began with praise and worship, led by Director Hong Sung-pyo. Following a prayer by Team Leader Lee Hyun-chul, Pastor Lim Jun-ho delivered a message titled, "Raising Up Davids within the Armies of All Nations." The sermon emphasized God's calling to establish people of faith within the military of each nation and highlighted the role of MSO.

In the second session, ministry reports from the World Mission Bureau were presented.

Director Hong shared the vision and mindset for the ministry, while Team Leaders Kye Yong-ho and Yoon Moon-soo reported on missions in the Middle East and Africa. A testimony from Team Leader Lee Hyun-chul also provided insight into the grace experienced in the field.

This dedication service went beyond a simple event; it was a time of commitment to faithfully live as devoted servants, anticipating the work God will accomplish through military missions.

East Africa Regional Conference: A Renewed Commitment to the Mission

From March 2 to 5, approximately 100 participants from nine nations convened in Limuru, Kenya, for the East Africa MCF Regional Conference, reaffirming their commitment to the gospel mission. Under the theme "Reawakening for the Mission," AMCF leaders and MSO Korea joined together to share directions for future collaboration.

Participants deepened their understanding of regional MCF ministries and strengthened cooperative frameworks among MSO, MMI, and ACCTS. The devoted ministry of the Ethiopia MCF brought great challenge and grace to all.

Centered on the message, “Arise, shine, for your light has come” (Isaiah 60:1), attendees made a renewed commitment to spread the light of the gospel within the military.

In addition, discussions were held on building networks for countries where MCF has not yet been established, along with plans for ongoing cooperation. This conference was not merely a gathering, but a launchpad for the fulfillment of the Great Commission in East Africa and to reaffirm the shared calling.



3 AMCF Activities

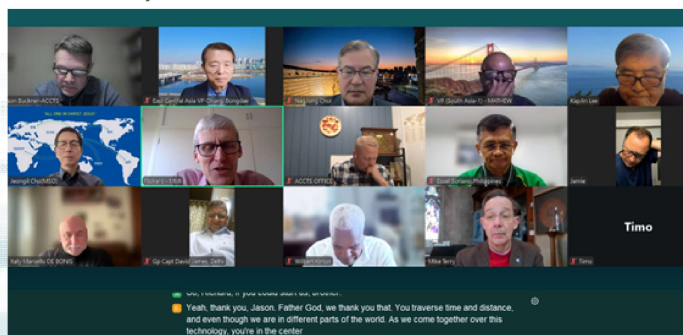
a. AMCF Watch & Pray: Ongoing Intercessory Prayer for Global Military Missions

The “Watch & Pray” ministry of the AMCF persists in fortifying the spiritual wall of intercessory prayer for global military missions. around the world. This initiative is a global united prayer movement that shares urgent needs and prayer requests from military mission fields across nations. In particular, focused prayer is being offered for conflict zones, countries where the gospel is restricted, and regions where faith communities within the military are still underdeveloped. Through this, spiritual solidarity and cooperation are being expanded. In accordance with the Word, “Watch and pray” (Matthew 26:41), the Watch & Pray ministry is faithfully carrying out the role of spiritual watchmen for military mission fields and is expected to continue growing in the days ahead.



b. Pray & Plan for 2026 ALI (AMCF Leaders Interaction)

The Pray & Plan (P&P) meeting for the 2026 AMCF Leaders Interaction (ALI) was held to review the ministry direction and strengthen spiritual preparation. This gathering went beyond simple event planning, focusing on aligning our strategic vision with prayer to advance the gospel across the globe of military evangelism.



Participants shared a common vision that through ALI, military Christian leaders from each nation would be spiritually renewed and established as key leaders for the expansion of the gospel. Key topics discussed included regional growth strategies, MCF ministry models, security considerations, and leadership vision. In particular, the participants reaffirmed that all preparations must be centered on God. The meeting concluded with united prayer, seeking the expansion of God's Kingdom.

c. Southern Africa Monthly Prayer Meeting (Online): Interceding for Africa

On March 5, MSO joined the Southern Africa Monthly Prayer Meeting online, taking part in intercessory prayer for military missions in Africa. Participants shared the Word and prayed specifically for four African countries, while also discussing regional issues and updates related to the 2026 Table Mountain Top Interaction (TMTI). This gathering served as a meaningful time to reaffirm the importance of united prayer.



d. Central Asia Vision Prayer Meeting: Preparing for the "Stan-Dart" Conference and Strengthening Cooperation

On March 10, the Central Asia Vision Prayer Meeting was held to discuss preparations for the 2026 "Stan-Dart" Conference and explore ways to strengthen cooperation in military missions. Key issues, including the venue deposit, were shared, and it was agreed that support would be requested from MSO after finalizing the plans. The meeting also reviewed cooperation with the Kyrgyzstan MCF, pastoral invitation initiatives, and the current status of participation in the East & Central Asia Conference (a total of 18 registrants). This gathering served as a time of prayerful preparation for the expansion of military missions and strengthened collaboration in Central Asia.



4 KVMCF-KMCF Joint Breakfast Worship Service : A Time of Grace and Unity

On April 1, the KVMCF-KMCF Joint Breakfast Worship Service was held at the Central Military Chapel, where members of the military mission community gathered in worship and unity. Pastor Seo Hyun-cheol delivered a message from Isaiah 53:5, encouraging participants to reflect the grace they have received in both their lives and ministries.



Following the service, fellowship and a joint meeting were held to share directions for cooperation and ministry. Participants also took time to renew their sense of calling and identity in military missions.

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Reawakened for Mission: East Africa Regional Conference Highlights

First, I give all thanks, praise, and glory to the Lord God Almighty.

I attended the East Africa Regional Conference held in Nairobi from March 1 to 5. This conference is an important annual spiritual and military mission gathering sponsored by MMI (UK) and ACCTS (USA). Korea participated directly again through MSO for the first time in approximately 16 years. I would like to briefly share three personal reflections and missional implications.

First, I was deeply re-awakened to the sacred mission of the East African MCF.

The theme of the conference was “Re-awakened for Mission” (Joel 2:28), which serves as a practical extension of the AMCF World Conference theme, “Arise and Shine” (Isaiah 60:1). Notably, two representatives from South Sudan—where MCF has not yet been established—were invited, and concrete discussions on its formation took place. In addition, meaningful discussions were held on the spiritual and social responsibility of caring for retired military personnel. Through this, I realized that this conference was not merely a gathering, but a platform for executing mission.

Second, it was a time of personal spiritual reawakening.

During the conference, I was deeply challenged through three expository sermons. The core messages were: “Receive the fullness of the Holy Spirit through deep repentance,” and “Live as letters of Christ.” In particular, the phrase “Arise and Shine in a better position” remained deeply in my heart.

Third, I gained a renewed calling for the Ethiopia MCF Center construction mission.

The most impactful challenge from the conference was the Ethiopia MCF Center construction project. The center is currently being built in Addis Ababa, with a total budget of approximately USD 1.8 million. Notably, the Ministry of Defense donated a 2,000m² site, and Colonel (Pastor) Eshetu Deata, President of Ethiopia MCF, has taken out a loan using his personal residence as collateral to move the project forward. This brought great inspiration.

Together with the East Africa MCF leaders who attended, we became convinced that this is not merely a building, but a hub for military missions in Africa. At the heart of this ministry lies a legacy of sacrificial devotion. This ministry will expand beyond Ethiopia to East Africa and ultimately across the entire African continent as a military mission platform.

I firmly believe that God will accomplish this mission. Thank you.
