1 Vietnam Cornelius Discipleship Training Successfully Completed - Accelerating the Development of Local Military Mission Leadership

Vietnam Cornelius Discipleship Training was successfully held in Hanoi from February 24–27 with 24 VMCF leaders from across Vietnam participating. Through biblical leadership training, IBS/CP practice, and AMCF ministry education, participants strengthened their spiritual foundations and commitment to military evangelism in Vietnam.

2 Myanmar Cornelius Discipleship Training Successfully Completed - Raising 27 Local Military Mission Leaders

The “Myanmar Cornelius Discipleship Training” for the evangelization of the Myanmar military was held in Yangon from March 31 to April 3 with 27 MMCF members participating. Elder Lee Kap-jin, Southeast Asia Team Leader Choi Sang-bok, and Missionary Lee Jae-yool led sessions on discipleship, leadership, and New Testament-centered Bible study. Through the training, participants renewed their calling and strengthened local military mission leadership in Myanmar.

4 MSO Education and Training Division Holds Workshop at Kwanglim Retreat Center

The Education and Training Division of the MSO held a workshop at the Kwanglim Retreat Center from April 10 to 11 with 12 staff members and officers in attendance. Participants discussed the 2026 ministry plans and the operational direction of key programs including FMF-K Interaction, MEO Program, and AMCF Leaders Interaction.

Key topics included improving training efficiency, preparing Korean and English materials, expanding “Jesus Story” sessions, strengthening airport welcome ministry, and establishing an AI simultaneous interpretation system. The workshop served as an opportunity to strengthen the effectiveness and direction of military mission education ministries.



5 MSO Invites Overseas Christian Defense Attachés to Strengthen Military Mission Network

MSO held a fellowship event for overseas Christian defense attachés on April 21, attended by representatives from Russia, Malaysia, Nigeria, Iraq, and the UAE. The gathering included an introduction to MSO ministries, dinner, and fellowship.

The participants expressed appreciation for Korea’s active role in global military missions and shared their commitment to cooperate in ministry within their respective nations.

The event strengthened international military mission partnerships and global networking efforts.



6 MSO Middle East Team Strengthens Mission Partnership

The MSO Middle East Team visited the Middle East Team (MET) on April 7 to discuss cooperation for Middle East missions. Both sides agreed to establish practical partnership and support systems, including regular exchanges and financial support. The meeting strengthened strategic cooperation for the evangelization of the Middle East.



7 2026 FMF-K Interaction to Be Held in Korea

The MSO will host the 2026 FMF-K (Foreign Military Fellowship in Korea) Interaction from May 23 to 25 at the Kwanglim Retreat Center. A total of 49 participants from 14 countries, including foreign military personnel and their families, are expected to attend.

The program will include leadership training, IBS and CP discipleship, introductions to AMCF, MSO, and KMCF ministries, Korean culture experiences, and testimonies from each nation's MCF. MSO hopes the event will strengthen global military mission networks and encourage the establishment of MCFs worldwide.

8 AMCF Activities

a. East & Central Asia Vision Prayer Meeting Held

Eighteen key leaders of the East and Central Asia mission network gathered on April 11 for the "2026 Second Quarter Vision Prayer Meeting." Discussions focused on preparations for the 2026 East & Central Asia MCF Conference and strategies to expand ministry in Central Asia. Through vision sharing and prayer, participants reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening military mission cooperation across Asia.



b. World Mission Division Holds Prayer Meeting for Nations Without MCFs

The World Mission Division held a prayer meeting on April 26 for 41 nations where MCFs have not yet been established. Participants gathered in united prayer for the spiritual needs of these nations and the spread of the Gospel. The meeting also included sharing mission field reports and discussing future ministry directions.



9 Military Mission Policy Meeting Held

Military mission leaders from six organizations gathered on April 29 in Seoul to discuss cooperation and ministry direction. Key topics included preparations for the 35th Korean War National Prayer Rally and strategies to strengthen the Vision 2030 ministry initiative.

Participants also shared ministry updates and reinforced partnerships for military evangelism.
