1 Central Asia MCF Leaders Retreat Strengthens Spiritual Unity and Leadership

The Central Asia MCF Leaders Retreat was held from 5–10 August at Issyk-Kul, Kyrgyzstan, bringing together about 50 MCF leaders and representatives from five Central Asian countries.

Participants shared a meaningful time of worship, prayer, Bible teaching, leadership training, and ministry reports, strengthening their fellowship in Christ and renewing their vision for military ministry across the region.

Representing MSO, Rev. Chung Bong-dae, Vice President for East-Central Asia (ECA), and missionary Kang attended the retreat. Rev. Chung introduced the vision and ministry direction of the East-Central Asia MCF and encouraged participants to remain united in the Gospel and continue strengthening their national MCF ministries.

Throughout the retreat, national representatives shared updates on military ministry in their countries, while small-group discussions and fellowship further strengthened regional cooperation.

The retreat concluded with a time of united prayer for the evangelization of Central Asia, the growth of MCF ministries, and the development of the next generation of Christian military leaders. MSO remains committed to supporting and partnering with Central Asia MCFs as they continue advancing the Gospel throughout the region.

2 Planning Meeting Held for the East-Central Asia Regional Conference

A planning meeting for the East-Central Asia Regional Conference was held on 13 July at the Central Military Chapel. KMCF organizing committee members and MSO representatives reviewed the conference preparations and discussed key plans for the event.

Among those attending were KMCF organizing committee members led by Elder Han Hyun-jin, Elder Chung Nam-ki, Mr. Lim Chul-soo, Director of MSO's Domestic Operations Division, the Operations Director, and Rev. Chung Bong-dae, AMCF Vice President for East-Central Asia (ECA).

The meeting reviewed the conference program, assigned responsibilities, and agreed to hold a weekly prayer meeting every Monday from 8:30 to 9:00 p.m. until the conference. Plans for supporting overseas participants after the closing service were also discussed.

A total of 38 participants from 10 countries have confirmed their attendance. The organizing committee expressed its commitment to continue preparing in prayer and cooperation, with the hope that the conference will strengthen unity among MCFs across East and Central Asia and encourage military ministry throughout the region.

3 World Missions Division Holds July United Prayer Meeting

The MSO World Missions Division held its July United Prayer Meeting on 25 July at Sarang Church, attended by nine staff members and supporters.

The meeting began with intercessory prayer for global military ministry, asking God to guide the work in each nation and grant wisdom and strength to missionaries and ministry leaders. Participants also shared ministry updates, prayer requests, and fellowship, encouraging one another while strengthening their shared vision for global military missions.

The gathering reaffirmed that regular prayer and fellowship are vital to the advancement of military ministry worldwide. The World Missions Division will continue to strengthen its prayer network through regular monthly prayer meetings.

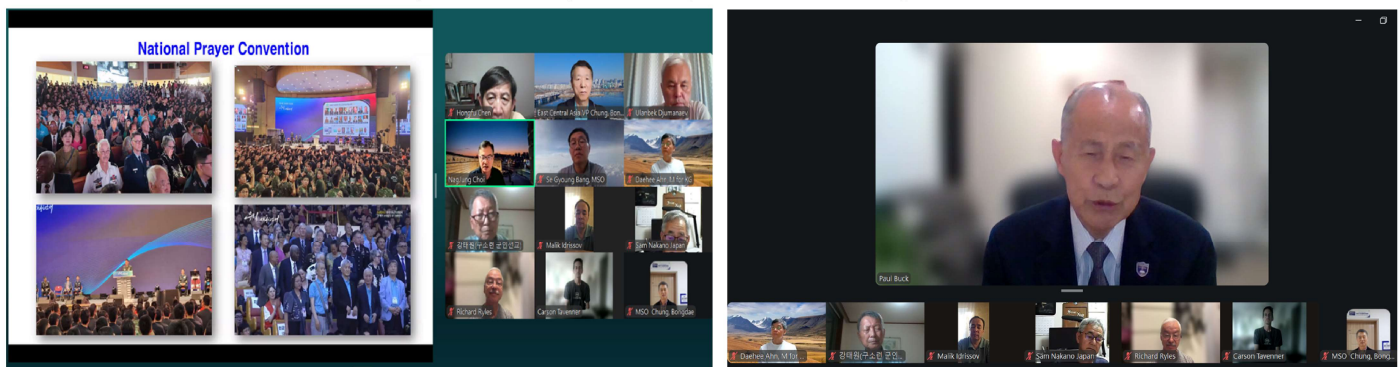
The next United Prayer Meeting will be held on 29 August at the Central Naval Church.



4 AMCF Activities

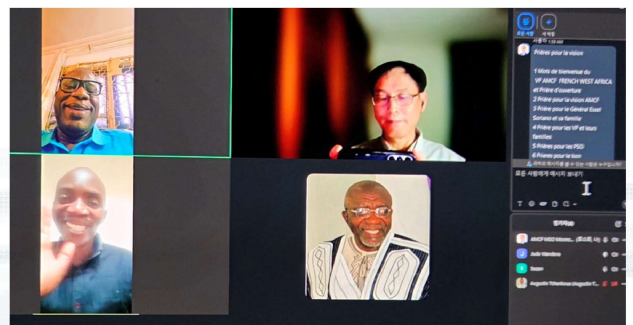
a. East & Central Asia Vision Prayer Meeting Held

The 2026 East & Central Asia Vision Prayer Meeting was held online on 11 July, bringing together 13 participants, including MCF presidents, the ECA Vice President, the ACCTS Liaison Officer, and partner missionaries from nine countries. Participants shared updates on military ministry, the 3PSO ministries, preparations for the 2026 East & Central Asia Regional Conference, and the Central Asia MCF Leaders' Retreat. They also prayed together for the spread of the Gospel and strengthened cooperation and unity in military ministry across the region.



b. Francophone Africa MCF Prayer Meeting Held

The Francophone Africa MCF Prayer Meeting was held online on 10 July, with MCF representatives from Benin, Cameroon, Mali, Chad, and other French-speaking African countries. Participants prayed for peace in their nations, military ministry, the spiritual growth of MCF members, and the spread of the Gospel. The meeting also strengthened unity among the Francophone Africa MCFs and reaffirmed their commitment to ongoing prayer and cooperation in advancing military ministry.
